

New <u>Daytime</u> Alpha Course to begin Thursday, August 31 with Taste of Alpha!


You've heard a lot about how God has used the Alpha Course to touch many hearts in our church and community. Now for the first time we are offering Alpha in the afternoon!



The Youth Mission Team will their adventures share ministry from Boston at both the 8 AM and 10:30 AM services.






Our Church History

The Tide of Idealism (1865—1918)

As one would expect, Methodism was not exempt from the aftereffects of the Civil War. 200 Years of United Methodism: An Illustrated History tells us that "two kinds of idealism irradiated the American spirit" in the years that followed the War between the States. "Southern idealism worshiped at the shrine of departed glory, northern idealism at the shrine of approaching glory." Southern sentiment was nostalgic; northern was progressive — visualizing "a material and moral progress marching in lock step toward the kingdom of God in America. This was the genesis of the belief that "American might and Christian right were leading the procession to God's kingdom."

Prior to moving forward with this vision, however, the Methodist, United Brethren and Evangelical churches in the newly re-United States had to help shore up the hard feelings the Civil War had left behind. To this end, two dozen ministers and a dozen laymen of the Methodist Episcopal Church-South met in Palmyra, Missouri in June of 1965. Following this meeting, they issued this statement: "We consider the maintenance of our separate and distinct ecclesiastical organization as of paramount importance and our imperative duty." Between the lines, this read that they believed "northern Methodist preachers had 'become political hucksters instead of gospel ministers." This narrative continues in multiple and varying forms today.

But despite these differences, the work of the church in the early Reconstruction years, both north and south consisted strongly of further expanding the church's geographical reach, particularly west, and reopening colleges that had to close during the war years.

At the close of Reconstruction, worship in these three ecumenical denominations had become "less spontaneous and more staid, although it was primarily Methodists who took steps to introduce formal orders of Sunday worship." (Well, we were originally coined "Methodists" due to our founders' devoted fixation on method!)
