Prior to being appointed here, Pastor K was Senior Pastor for Sedan, Elgin, and Wauneta United Methodist Churches (KS; 2018-2023); Senior Pastor for Arma and Pittsburg Grace United Methodist Churches (KS; 2016-2018); Youth and Young Adult Associate Pastor for the Queens Central and Commack Korean United Methodist Churches (NY; 2013-2016) and served in various Youth/Young Adult Ministries as a Director in South Korea (2008-2012).

Pastor K's ministry focus includes preaching /teaching the Word of God, equipping believers to live out their faith in everyday life, building relationships and ministering to all people, and Multicultural and Next Generation Ministry.

"I am very passionate about sharing the Word of God, as I believe that the Bible is the living Word of God. My calling is to teach, serve, and lead people towards a connection with God and the growth of their faith. I believe that the church is a community of love and support, and that we should share God's love with each other while building relationships and ministering to all those in need.

I am thrilled to be a part of Columbus First United Methodist Church and its ministry. I firmly believe that God has great plans for this church, and I am eager to see what will happen through us, the church family, and this wonderful ministry."

Pastor K is married to Rev. Seulki Choi (or Rev. Sarah Choi (aka 'Pastor K's Sarah') — who is a provisional Deacon at the Great Plains Annual Conference). They have one daughter, Vivian, who will be a 5th grader at Columbus Middle School this fall, and one cat named Hart. Board of Trustees Report on the Air Conditioning Status

Approximately three weeks ago, we experienced a power outage that affected both the Church and the Outreach Center. When the power was restored, we had three air conditioning units that were no longer working at the Outreach Center. While we were able to fix one unit, we had to replace the other two. The approximate cost for this is \$12,000.

A few days later, the compressor for the unit that cools the Sanctuary at the Church failed. The cost to replace this compressor would be \$15,000. The Board of Trustees has determined that this would not be a practical course of action because the unit is 20-plus years old and we continue to experience problems with the heating side of it each winter. We decided that a better choice would be to replace the unit at a cost of \$40,000.

While the Church has money to cover this expense in the Peg Jeffreys Emergency Maintenance Fund, this expenditure will substantially deplete the fund's balance. As such, we're asking for your help to replenish it. Please prayerfully consider a donation toward this endeavor. Shelly and I are pledging \$5,000 to jump-start this effort. Together, we can help ensure that the next unexpected yet essential repair or replacement expense can be met.

New <u>Daytime</u> Alpha Course to begin Thursday, August 31 with Taste of Alpha!


You've heard a lot about how God has used the Alpha Course to touch many hearts in our church and community. Now for the first time we are offering Alpha in the afternoon!

Classroom locations will be posted throughout the building.







Our Church History

The Tide of Pluralism (1919-1984)

According to 200 Years of United Methodism: An Illustrated History, "the modern, pluralistic world began in 1919 when photographs of a solar eclipse confirmed Albert Einstein's theory of relativity." While Einstein was interested only the relativity of space and time, others argued for the relativity of "goodness and truth." Many proponents of relativity "poured old certainties of God, nation, and family into a cauldron, from which arose the steam of numerous moralities, numerous theologies, numerous 'isms'." These 'isms' included patriotism (WWI), secularism (the Roaring '20s) pacifism, modernism, fundamentalism and many more.

While the many and varied 'isms' "competed for Americans' loyalty, "the variety of theologies confused their minds and the variety of moralities confounded their lives." Depending on who one listened to, "celibacy and promiscuity, heterosexuality and homosexuality, faithfulness and adultery were equally good." (What comes around continues to come around, evidently!)

But while acceptance of diversity has been a dominant feature in Methodism since the tide of pluralism, if the Methodists had focused on diversity alone, the United Methodist Church of 1968 would never have been born. "What made the new denomination possible was the quest for unity along with the acceptance of diversity."

During the Great Depression years of the 1930s, the Methodist, Evangelical and United Brethren churches set up breadlines and soup kitchens for those in need—even when they themselves were struggling. "Bishops' salaries were cut in half, pastors' salaries sharply reduced, college instructors dismissed or endured pay cuts, missionaries called home, church mortgages refinanced." And despite what many pastors reportedly thought would occur, "tight economic times did not drive persons to God."

The '40s were dominated by WWII; the '50s, egged on by a widespread fear of Communism, was the "America Under God" decade; the '60s brought us Vietnam (and anti-war sentiment, and the Civil Rights movement, and a rampant nation-wide drug problem)—yet we still managed to celebrate 200 years of Methodism in America during the 1970s! Denominational membership numbers were down across the board, yet Christianity in general—United Methodism in particular—simply continued to stay the course. As historian Paul Johnson reportedly observed, "The outstanding non-event of modern times was the failure of religious belief to disappear."

This "modern non-event" continues to this day, as United Methodists around the world answer our call to bring the Word of God and love of Jesus to any and all who will receive it from us.
