

Reduce Reuse Recycle

Why is recycling listed last? Because it's the weakest link. If we, especially as Christians, want to have a beneficial effect on creation by limiting physical waste and pollution, the best action we can take is to reduce the amount of waste we produce in the first place.

Where we can't avoid producing waste, we can make an effort to re-imagine the possibilities of what we are about to throw out. Instead, we can reuse it.

Recycling should be the last resort. The action we choose when we can't avoid producing waste and we can't reuse that waste, but we still want to dispose of it responsibly.

Recycling is not a bad option, just not the best. When we're done with something, we throw it out. Throwing away resources that can be recycled back into the economy is poor stewardship and a poor witness to the world.

Churches can recycle effectively. They have a lot to recycle: paper bulletins, plastic drink cups, water bottles, ink cartridges, and so on.

In the near future you will be seeing different recycle containers around the church for recycling within the church only. Educational materials and posters will also help you to identify what is recyclable and where it should be placed.

If you have any questions or comments, contact the church office and they will direct you to the proper channels to answer your recycling questions, or how to start a recycling program of your own at home.




