I have heard that word used more in the last week than I have in my entire life. It's difficult to know how to feel during this time of national crisis. We as believers know that God is watching over us. Isaiah 41:10 says, "So do not fear, for I am with you; do not be dismayed, for I am your God. I will strengthen you and help you; I will uphold you with my righteous right hand." However, we can still feel feelings of uncertainty, helplessness, and even fear. Imagine the emotions that children may be feeling during this time. It is important that we as parents and families have open discussions with our children.

Listed below are a few tips in how to talk to your children about COVID-19.

#1 - Remain calm and reassuring.

 Remember that children will react to both what you say and how you say it. They will pick up cues from the conversations you have with them and with others.

#2 - Make yourself available to listen and to talk.

 Make time to talk. Be sure children know they can come to you when they have questions.

#3 - Pay attention to what children see or hear on television, radio, or online.

· Consider reducing the amount of screen time focused on COVID-19. Too much information on one topic can lead to anxiety.

#4 - Provide information that is honest and accurate.

 Give children information that is truthful and appropriate for the age and developmental level of the child

#5 – Teach children everyday actions to reduce the spread of germs.

- Remind children to stay away from people who are coughing or sneezing or sick.
- Remind them to cough or sneeze into a tissue or their elbow, then throw the tissue into the trash.
- Get children into a handwashing habit.

Teach them to wash their hands with soap and water for at least 20 seconds, especially after blowing their nose, coughing, or sneezing; going to the bathroom; and before eating or preparing food.


