Go Therefore

The last Sunday of September, our worship Scripture from Luke 15 challenged us as individuals and as a community of faith to prioritize our God-given call to search, find, and walk with persons who are wandering apart from Christ, or know Christ but have yet to find a loving, nurturing community of faith.

Within a 20-minute drive there are as many as 14,000 people who rarely – if ever – attend worship or are connected in a local church, many never having had any significant connection with a church. As we learned, even among those with no church history, there is an openness to be a guest at worship if asked by a friend or family member, but many never receive an invitation.

As we go forward, we will be learning more about how we can better invite or connect with wanderers in our community, which might look different than we think and can be a lot less scary than we suppose. For now, we can start with embracing this as a part of our Calling as Disciples of Jesus and begin to pray for this passion to grow in our hearts, our members, and our ministries. We celebrate the fact our children and youth ministries are already living into this calling with a culture of invitation and hospitality, with some young people bringing friend after friend after friend on Wednesday nights.

Matthew 28:19-20 "Go therefore and make disciples of all nations, baptizing them in the name of the Father and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit and teaching them to obey everything that I have commanded you. And remember, I am with you always, to the end of the age."
