Make the Lord's Supper Craft as you read through Luke 22:14–20.

Imagine what it might have been like to have been there eating that Last Supper meal with Jesus. Talk about it or act it out with your family.

How can you love and serve others just like Jesus did?

Who can take the Lord's Supper?

Why did Jesus want His disciples to break bread and drink with Him?



FAMILY FEET WASHING ACTIVITY

You'll Need:

- Large Bowl
- Water
- Soap
- Towels and Washcloth
- Bible
- Optional: Worship Music

Instructions:

- 1 Read John 13:1–17 aloud to your family. (Optional: Turn on worship music)
- 2 Fill a large bowl (or plastic container) with water.
- 3 Take turns washing each others feet as an act of serving one another.

Take some time before, during, or after to talk about how Jesus, the King of kings washed the dirty feet of His disciples. What humility He showed! He came to serve others rather than to be served. What do you think this means? Talk about other ways that you can love and serve the people in your family and in your community like Jesus did. When you are all finished washing each family members feet, say Matthew 20:28 together.

MAIN IDEA + VERSE CARDS

Print these two pages on heavy cardstock front and back so that you can have the main idea on one side and the questions on the other as well as one verse on each side of a separate card. Use scissors to cut around each square to create individual cards. You can also laminate these pages for added durability.

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
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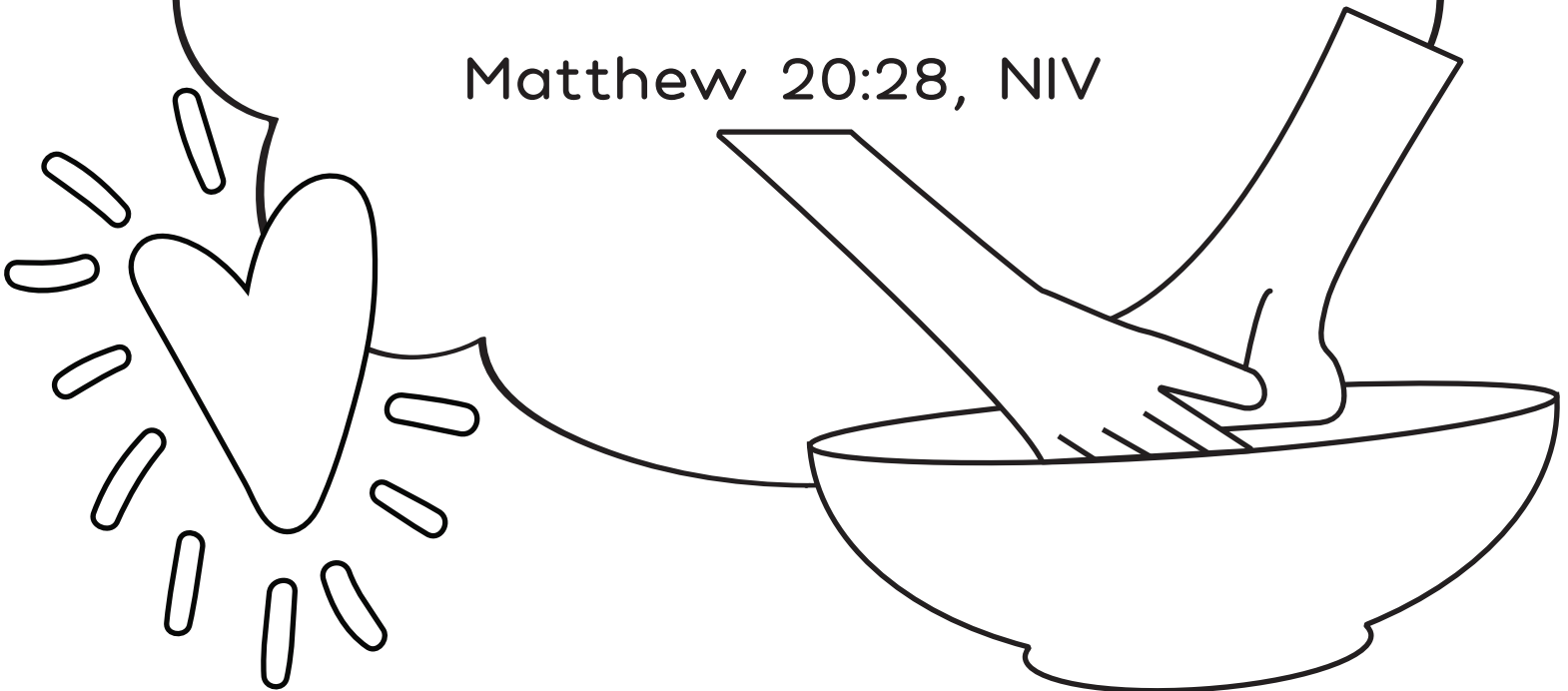

LORD'S SUPPER CRAFT

You'll Need:

- In Remembrance of Me Printable
- Cardstock
- Scissors
- Construction Paper
- Glue
- Crayons or Markers



Instructions:

- 1 Print the 'In Remembrance of Me' Printable on cardstock.
- 2 Freehand a chalice on construction paper (or use the included template) and cut it out. Invite your kids to decorate it with crayons/markers.
- 3 Cut out a loaf of bread from construction paper.
- 4 Glue the decorated chalice and bread to the picture.

LET'S DIVE DEEPER

The Last Supper is the last meal that Jesus would eat with His disciples before He died on the cross. Jesus did something very unusual and unexpected that night. He washed his disciples feet. In that culture, this act was reserved for a servant, not a King. In doing this, Jesus was showing His disciples an example of what love and humility looked like so that they could follow His example and love others.

During the Passover meal Jesus also gave the disciples a way to remember Him and what He was about to do on the cross. Jesus said the bread was His body, which was broken for us. Jesus said the wine was His blood, which was shed for us. The bread and wine remind us of what Jesus did for us on the cross!

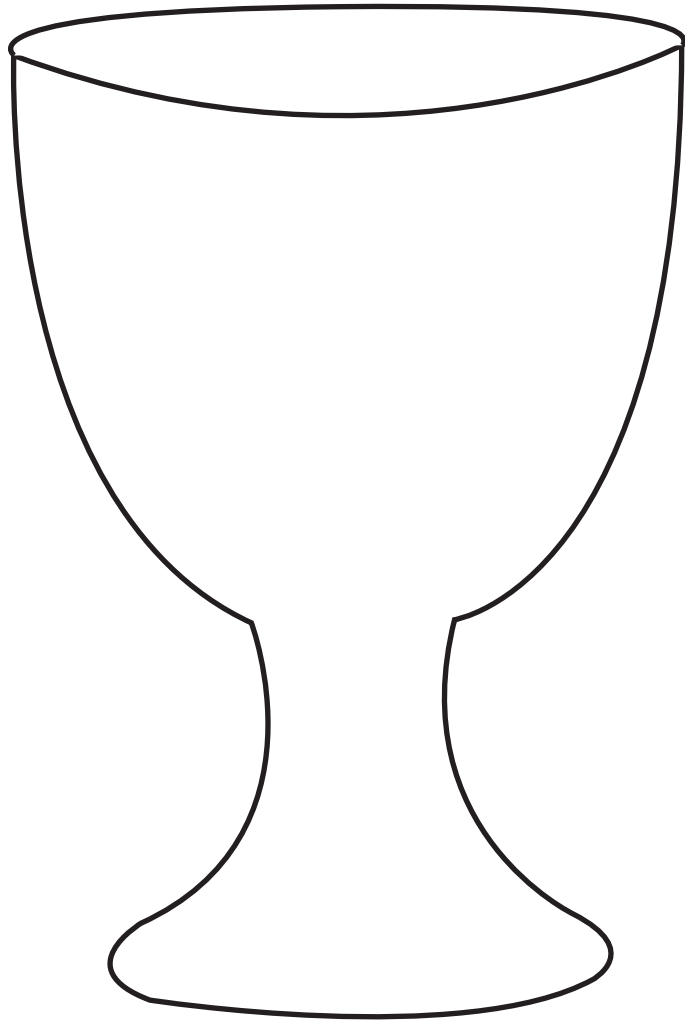
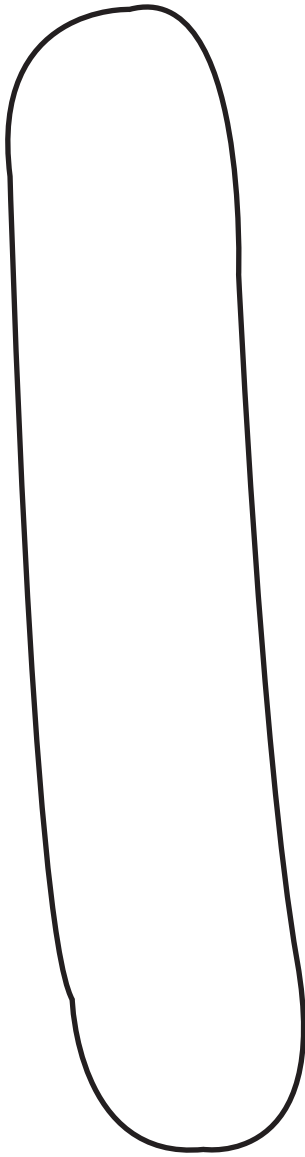
The Lord's Supper is a beautiful celebration for those who have repented of their sin and trusted in Jesus for salvation. Anyone who is a follower of Jesus can eat the bread and drink from the cup to remember what Jesus did for us in His death on the cross and resurrection.

DO THIS IN REMEMBRANCE OF ME.

The Lord Jesus, on the night he was betrayed, took bread, and when he had given thanks, he broke it and said, "This is my body, which is for you; do this in remembrance of me." In the same way, after supper he took the cup, saying, "This cup is the new covenant in my blood; do this, whenever you drink it, in remembrance of me.
