	1 <i>Psalm 145:1-8</i> O King of heaven, I will bless and praise your name, for your mighty, awesome acts of righteousness, love and grace surround me. You are a gracious and merciful God who shows lovingkindness to your children. I will shout for joy because of your greatness!	2 <i>John 3:1-21</i> Thank you, God, for Jesus Christ being the only source of eternal life; only through him can we be saved. Let the world, through the power of the Holy Spirit, see the light of Christ in everything I do, for the sake of those who will inherit eternal life.	3 <i>1 Thessalonians 1:2-10</i> Thank you, God, for choosing me to bear witness of your love and grace to those who are lost. Show me how to pray for their salvation in the love of Christ. Keep my affections totally on you, O Lord, so others see the love I have for you.	4 <i>1 Samuel 1:1-28</i> God, as I come to you in prayer and supplication as Hannah did, hear the deep cries of my heart. In your lovingkindness, hear my petitions and answer them according to your will. I dedicate myself and my children to your service, according to your word.	5 <i>Psalm 25:4-10</i> Lord, help me to know your ways. Lead me in your truth and teach me. For you I wait all day long. According to your steadfast love, remember me. You will forever set me on the path of love and truthfulness.	6 <i>James 1:2-12</i> Father God, when in a trial, give me wisdom. Teach me your precepts and how to walk through the trial with your help. Keep me close to your heart so that I do not stray from your word. Bless me in my perseverance with the reward that awaits me.
7 <i>Psalm 23:1-6</i> Lord, I have no wants with you by my side. I know you will lead me on the best path for my journey. I am not afraid of death because you are always with me. You comfort me all the days of my life and I rejoice that I will live in heaven forever!	8 <i>Colossians 3:15-17</i> Lord, you call us to a world of peace and thankfulness. As we teach with wisdom and sing with joy and gratitude in our hearts, may everything we do and say be done in your name, Lord Jesus, always giving thanks to God the Father.	9 <i>Psalm 29:1-11</i> Lord, you are my strength. When I am weak, you are strong. You are my El Shaddai. Let my enemies tremble before you. Give me a tiny bit of your strength so that I might not give into discouragement and doubt, and know peace.	10 <i>Genesis 33:1-11</i> Although Jacob expected his brother Esau to exact revenge over their father's stolen blessing, Esau instead ran to embrace Jacob, and they wept with joy! Jacob had lived imprisoned by his guilt, but he was released by God's favor and the undying love of Esau. May we always live as loving and forgiving as Esau.	11 <i>Hebrews 13:1-3</i> Dear God, never let me forget to show hospitality to those who you send my way—even a stranger. Help me to share the gospel with them so they will know your all-encompassing love. Remind me to pray for those in prison and those who are ill-treated by others.	12 <i>Proverbs 3:5-6</i> Father, your word tells us if we will bring our concerns and worries to you on a daily basis, he will give us wisdom and will guide us in all our decisions. As we trust in you, you will give us refreshment for our bodies and our spirit.	13 <i>Romans 8:31-39</i> Nothing on earth or in heaven can separate us from the love of God. Though we face trials on earth and things that would take us away from our faith in God, we are more than conquerors through you who loves us.
14 <i>Psalm 34:4-7</i> Lord, teach me to seek you when I am fearful about my future. I will not fear, for you have sent your angels to protect and rescue me. Answer me when I call your name—Jehovah Nissi—the Lord is my banner. Rescue me from all my troubles.	15 <i>Acts 26:12-18</i> Lord, please help me see Your light and turn from the power of Satan to the power of God. I want to be your servant and walk the path you have for me, but I can do that only with your help. I surrender my heart to you.	16 <i>John 1:35-50</i> Lord, you call many to follow you and bring their special gifts to your ministry. You challenge all to believe in you, and to trust that you can use them. When we are called, may we not question why, but also trust that you know us and how our gifts can be used.	17 <i>Romans 8:25-28</i> Thank you, Father, for providing your Spirit to be by my side. If I don't know how or what to pray, your Spirit prays for me by making prayers out of my wordless groans. The Spirit knows me far better than I know myself. Thanks be to God!	18 <i>Psalm 103:13-18</i> Father God, you know your children by name. Help us to have a holy respect for who you are and why you have chosen us. Your precepts are life to us, a plumb-line for keeping your covenant. We know our time on earth is but fleeting, but you are everlasting.	19 <i>Isaiah 46:3-4</i> Father, from womb, birth, old age, and graying years, you uphold, carry and deliver us every day. You love your beloved children—Jews first, and your sons and daughters in Christ. Bless you, Father, for holding us close to your heart and never changing who you are.	20 <i>John 11:1-44</i> Jesus, help us believe with Martha that you are the Messiah, the Son of God, the One coming into the world. You are the Resurrection and the Life. Keep us in an expectant spirit of your Light in our hearts so we can see your Glory.
21 <i>Psalm 1:1-6</i> Dear God, I want to be counted among your congregation of the righteous. May I meditate on your law day and night. May I be like a tree planted by streams of water, yielding fruit in its season and prospering in all I do. Lord, watch over me in all my ways.	22 <i>Luke 7:11-16</i> Jesus, in your tender mercy, you brought a widow's only son back from death with a single touch on the coffin. Likewise, we know you are able to raise our souls from a deathbed of despair and sin. For that, may we be filled with awe and praise God.	23 <i>James 5:13-18</i> Believer, if you are suffering, pray and sing praises. If you are sick, ask the church to pray for you. The prayer of faith will save the sick. If sin has been committed, God will forgive. Confess your sins and pray for one another in God's name.	24 <i>Exodus 4:10-13</i> Lord, give me a heart that is willing to obey, no matter the cost. Teach me to be slow to say no to your requests. Through your Holy Spirit, I am able to do mighty things. For you are my salvation and I will rely on you and not be afraid.	25 <i>Matthew 25:14-30</i> Lord, you gift us with talents that can be useful to your ministry. However, if we keep our abilities to ourselves and never share, you will strip us and give those gifts to someone who knows that our talent is only good if it is shared with others for your glory.	26 <i>Hebrews 10:19-25</i> Jesus, thank you for dying on the cross for our sins and for now being our High Priest who intercedes for us to God. Help us come to you with a sincere heart in order to have a more personal relationship with you. Lord, you are faithful.	27 <i>Psalm 103:1-12</i> God, your love for us is love that is more expansive than we can understand. We sin on a daily basis, but with a confessing heart to you. Those transgressions are removed far from us and we are renewed. You are a compassionate and gracious God.
28 <i>Mark 5:1-20</i> Lord, you called the evil spirits named Legion from the tormented man who lived in the tombs, you drove them into the herd of pigs, and they were immediately drowned. The people feared the powerful force they had witnessed, but the grateful man, no longer tormented, went home and told all of your mercy.	29 <i>2 Corinthians 3:1-6</i> God, under your first covenant—those laws written on tablets of stone—man was condemned to death as lawbreakers. You sent Jesus, who has written a new covenant—one "with the Spirit of the living God...on tablets of human hearts." The old covenant brought death, the new covenant brought life.	30 <i>Psalm 91:1-16</i> Heavenly Father, your word tells me you are my shelter in times of trouble. You will rescue me from the trap of the enemy. Your loving arms are a shield of protection. In times of disaster, even pestilence or plagues will not harm me.
