During Stepping Stones, children experience spiritual practices which open them up to God's grace. Stepping Stones provide parents and the church a way to fulfill their commitment to nurture children in faith.

When kids participate in something specific to a Stepping Stone, they receive a stone to mark that experience: each time they take communion, watch a baptism, lead prayer or song in worship, participate in a workshop, or engage in service. Kids will have special boxes to hold their "stones," and kids are encouraged to play with the items because interactive play is a powerful way to relive and remember those special moments.
