

We are pleased to present the 2024–2025 Year-End Report, highlighting the incredible work that was made possible through the dedication and generosity of our volunteers and supporters from July 1, 2024, to June 30, 2025.

This year has been truly remarkable, marked by **\$588,643 in financial contributions**. Additionally, **329 volunteers** gave **7,453 hours of their time**, representing the equivalent of **\$367,281 in non-cash donations**. Altogether, this amounts to a **combined impact of \$955,924** in support and service.

Volunteers were sent to **12 nations**, and CSi stood with **83,132** individuals across **21 nations** in bringing help, healing, and hope to communities in crisis through the power of compassionate service.

Project Highlights:

Algeria

Volunteers provided support and humanitarian aid in refugee zones, continuing relationships built in previous years. We provided funds for medicine and humanitarian aid.

Bangladesh

In response to flooding in the Mymensingh district, CSi provided disaster relief funds and aided **95 families** (approx. **570 individuals**) with essential food and supplies.

Belize

Following widespread fires, CSi delivered emergency aid to help **150 families** (approx. **750 individuals**) with food and supply kits.

Brazil

Flood relief efforts reached **100 families** (approx. **500 people**) with humanitarian aid distributed to address housing and food shortages.

Cuba

CSi provided critical medical supplies and medications to support healthcare needs in the country.

Guatemala

Volunteers worked alongside a local orphanage, **HOME International**, to bring humanitarian aid and Christmas gifts for all the orphans.

Guyana

The CSI medical team held **three clinics** and saw **97 patients**. They also provided humanitarian aid to **100 families** (approx. **500 individuals**).

Israel

CSI has stood with Israel by feeding **500 families** (approx. **2,500 individuals**) each month and helping the team establish a **weekly feeding center**. They also feed families on the West Bank.

Japan

A team participated in outreach efforts including a beach cleanup and community-based humanitarian service.

Jordan

CSI worked with a local team to ensure that funds were available to support displaced families with food, medical, and hygiene supplies.

Martinique

Volunteers engaged in a **Back-to-School Serve Day** that equipped **75 students** with resources to attend the 2025 school year.

Mayotte

In the wake of a devastating typhoon, CSI provided **\$15,000** in relief, reaching **200 families** (approx. **5,000 individuals**) with food, shelter, and hygiene resources.

St. Maarten

Volunteers supported a local church whose facilities were never rebuilt following the destruction of a previous hurricane.

Spain

CSI responded to severe flooding with **\$10,000** in relief, distributing **500 aid boxes** (approx. **5,000–7,000 individuals**).

Switzerland

Volunteers partnered with a local nonprofit to create **200 backpacks** filled with hygiene supplies for women affected by local sex trafficking, offering them a pathway to a new life.

Tanzania

Volunteers participated in an orphan feeding project, delivering supplies of clothing and food, and hosting activities for **30 families**, including orphans and relatives caring for orphaned children.

Togo

CSi provided humanitarian aid including mosquito nets, soap, glasses, and supplies for children, and partnered with a local nonprofit to provide food for prisoners.

Trinidad

Volunteers led a soccer camp for **over 90 children** and served in local humanitarian efforts focused on children and youth.

Ukraine

CSi continues to support efforts in Ukraine, monthly reaching **500 families** (approx. **2,500 individuals**) affected by war through food, hygiene items, and spiritual encouragement.

Vanuatu

After a tsunami impacted coastal communities, CSi delivered **\$10,000** in medical supplies and food to vulnerable populations.

Access Challenged Nations

This year, we also had the opportunity to serve in Access Challenged Nations, where volunteers discreetly shared humanitarian aid and the love of Christ with families who had never encountered Christian believers before.
