Pastoral Nominating Committee

The Pastoral Nominating Committee continues to meet weekly. The PNC is now using the summarized information from the Next Chapter Surveys to write in narrative form the information that identifies RBPC's vision for ministry, how we feel called to reach out to the emerging needs of our community, characteristics of the future pastor, and tasks, assignments, and programs for which the new pastor will be responsible.

Once this is completed it will go to session for approval. Then once approved by session, this information will go onto a Ministry Information Form (standard for all PCUSA churches who are seeking a pastor).



Once that is completed, then RBPC can "send out" it's MIF via a Church Leadership Connection avenue so that pastors who are interested in a new pastorate can evaluate if they are interested in applying to be a pastor at RBPC. And as those applications are returned, the PNC will read and evaluate them. And then the decision process of determining our new pastor will be very active.

The PNC is continuing to complete the MInistry Information Form. Please pray for RBPC and the PNC as we go forward in this process.

Newsletter Changes

After a thoughtful yet difficult personnel budget reduction this year, we have updated our staff



position descriptions to honor their time in their revised positions. Consequently, we have eliminated the monthly newsletter tasks from our Office Administrator's responsibilities. Starting July, we will no longer have a paper newsletter and instead will focus on our email newsletter the "Enews". Session Highlights for May

- The following motion regarding Covid19 precautions was passed—**MOTION** that masks will continue to be required indoors in common areas, but that groups of vaccinated people may agree to remove masks while not in common areas. (Masks will continue to be required for Sunday worship services)
- During the Clerk's report, the following motions were approved: **MOTION** to approve the minutes of the April 18th stated meeting of session and the May 2nd called meeting of session. **MOTION** to remove the following

members from the rolls: Audrey Kooreman (#965) by reason of her death on April 21, 2021, and; Dianne Zbinden (#1923) by reason of her death on May 9, 2021. **MOTION** to release Pam Walker from service as a deacon.

 Elder Gray recapped preparations for the planned summer Youth Hometown Mission service projects (June 21-23). Session passed the **MOTION** for session to authorize use of \$4,000 from the church's "Preschool" designated fund to finance service project materials.



- During the Community & Spiritual Formation Committee report, Elder Chadwick presented plans for the transition of Rev. Erin Grayson's adult ministries in view of the termination of her contract at the end of the month. Session also passed the **MOTION** that the session approves the free, monthly use of the church labyrinth by the Dances of Peace group, including welcoming them to use a restroom as needed. C&SF will handle the contact and scheduling
- During the Personnel Committee report, Session approved the MOTION to approve the revised position description for the Custodian/Caretaker. (This revision was warranted in view of the adjustment to hours and schedule for the job during the 2021 budget decision process.) The Personnel Committee also approved a position description for Nancy Lyman's temporary enhanced role as both keyboardist and music director following Sharon's recent retirement.
- During the Finance Committee, Elder Birum briefly recapped a number of items including that income and expenses are tracking generally as expected based on previous months.
- Session also addressed the subject of providing the Pastor Nominating Committee (PNC) with a range for a compensation offer for a prospective permanent pastor. The following was passed MOTION that the session authorize the PNC to offer a total compensation package in the range of \$110,000 to \$130,000 for hiring an installed pastor.
- Session members addressed at length the prospect of imposing a Bainbridge Island residence requirement on the next pastor. With no formal decision reached on specific limitations, there was general agreement that there was no need for PNC to mandate on-island residence.
- As for the Pastor Nominating Committee, Elder Dunn reported that the PNC is making progress, especially on the Ministry Information Form (MIF), and that it may be ready to present for session endorsement by the end of the month.

Erin's Letter

Dear Rolling Bay Presbyterian Church,

I want to thank you for the opportunity to serve the congregation of Rolling Bay Presbyterian Church as a part-time Associate Pastor during this interim period of transition at the church. As I have from the beginning of my ordained ministry at RBPC, I continued to enjoy teaching bible study, leading faith formation efforts, and preaching occasionally as offered to me in my contract.

When I learned in January that due to finances my contract would not be renewed, I began to prayerfully consider where God is calling me in my ministry. While I have not finalized my next steps, I feel called to serve in a role that will provide an opportunity to practice, grow, and expand my skills as a minister. To give me the time I need to prepare for my next steps, I would like to terminate my contract effective on May 24, 2021.

While this date is earlier than the expiration of my contract, it is good timing in that the bible studies I lead traditionally pause for a summer break during the months of June, July, and August. For my part, I will be able to finish the studies we're currently engaged in, and preach on the final date I was scheduled for on May 23. I will also be available to offer any support you may request in the transition.

I want to end how I began: by expressing my sincere gratitude for the congregation at Rolling Bay Presbyterian Church. You have been my family's "church" family over the years, and you nurtured my call to ministry. You called me to ordained ministry, and that connection will always be special. Although this change will affect my employment status, it won't change the love I have for this church. I'll carry that in my heart no matter where God leads me next.
