

Three Responses

Mark 14:1-11

Big Idea

Your response to Jesus reveals your heart.

1) A scheming heart of destruction 14: 1-2

... the chief priests and teachers of the law were scheming to arrest Jesus secretly and kill him.

What do I notice about the hearts of people who want to destroy Jesus?

2) A beautiful heart of devotion 14:3-9

She has done a beautiful thing.

What do I notice about the hearts of people who are devoted to Jesus?

3) A betraying heart of deception 14:10-11

... went to the chief priests to betray Jesus to them. So he watched for an opportunity to hand him over.

What do I notice about the hearts of those who betray Jesus through deception?

So what? As I think about what we studied here today, how am I able to answer these questions: *Which heart is my heart toward Jesus? Am I totally devoted in my worship of Him? How does that become a testimony that is told alongside the gospel?*

Small Group Questions

Harmony of the gospels: find parallel passages in Matthew 26 and John 12

1) **A scheming heart of destruction (Mark 14:1-2)**

Once again Mark tells us of the leaders of Israel wanting to put Jesus to death. Their hearts are bent on destroying Jesus. Talk about the reasons the leaders wanted Jesus to be put to death, as you remember them from earlier studies. Why do you think they were so concerned about waiting until after the festival? Was it because of their devotion to what the festival represented? Do you know any people who seem to scheme against Jesus? How do you respond to people who seem to hate the One you love so deeply?

2) **A beautiful heart of devotion (Mark 14:3-9)**

More than likely, this woman is Mary, who is identified in John's telling of this amazing account. Mary, who sat at the feet of Jesus (Luke 10:38ff), had learned to listen to what Jesus was saying. She listened when Jesus said that He was going to die. She came to prepare His body for burial by bringing perfume. Use your biblical imagination and enter into this narrative. Think of the disciples who were still, in some ways, jockeying for position. Think of the reaction as the fragrance filled the room and a year's wages was just spilled over the head and feet of Jesus. Think of the lingering aroma. Think about Jesus affirming her actions. Think of all we have studied in Mark to this point. Imagine you are in the room and you are one of the disciples. What is your response and your reaction? How do you think Mary responded to Jesus' affirmation and declaration of her actions?

3) **A betraying heart of deception (Mark 14:10-11)**

Judas was undone by the "waste" of the perfume. Apparently, this was some kind of proverbial straw for him. What do you think led Judas to consider betraying Jesus? Satan is the father of lies. Judas becomes a deceiver, hiding under cover to hand Jesus over. What do you think are the things that Judas thought about over the course of Jesus' ministry that caused him to enter into a betrayal contract with the chief priests?

4) **Consider the "so what" question of the week.**

Are there any thoughts you would like to share with the group?
