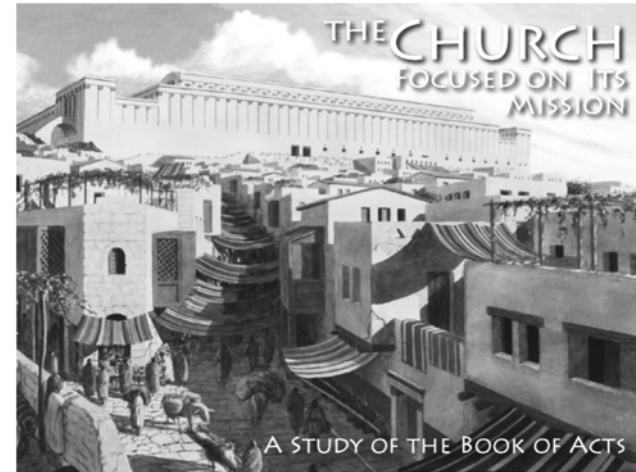

Coloring in the Snapshot

Acts 3:1-26

1) Jesus is the Real Need

Acts 3:1-10

Do I see the real needs of others?

2) Jesus is the Real Power

Acts 3:11-16

Am I trying to do things in my own strength?

3) Jesus is the Promised One

Acts 3:17-26

How has Jesus' coming to earth impacted my life?

So what? As I think about what we studied here today, how am I able to answer this question: *Am I proclaiming the gospel as the Real Need, in the Power of Jesus and grounded in the Promises of God?*

Small Group Questions

1. Jesus is the Real Need

Acts 3:1-10

The lame man was lame from birth. Since we are only a few months since Jesus ascended into heaven, most likely Jesus and His disciples had passed by this man while He was on earth, when Jesus went to the temple. Why do you think this man had not been healed before by Jesus (John 9:1-3)? Notice what the lame man was asking Peter and John. The lame man was focused on his immediate needs, not his real need. What are some things we can learn from the lame man's first request as well as his response to his healing?

2. Jesus is the Real Power

Acts 3:11-16

Peter explains the real power behind the miracle. Why do you think Peter says "not by our own power and piety" did this miracle happen? Peter explains in verse 16 that the healing was done by faith in the name of Jesus. What does "faith in the name of Jesus" mean? Why would faith in Jesus' name bring healing? How does verse 16 give us insight into the healing of this man?

3. Jesus is the Promised One

Acts 3:17-26

Peter says that they crucified Jesus out of ignorance, but then Peter says, in verse 18, that all this was foretold by the prophets. Why does it seem that a large majority of the Jewish culture missed or did not understand the prophecies of Jesus' first coming? Why did God choose the Israelite nation to be the nation in which salvation would come (Deut. 7:6-8)? How were the Israelite people to be a blessing to the nations? How does the book of Acts demonstrate the priority of the nation of Israel in the proclamation of the gospel?

4. Consider the "so what" question of the week.

Are there any thoughts you would like to share with the group?
