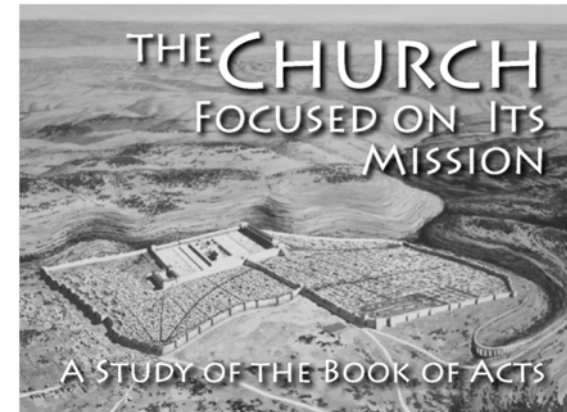

God's power for the Church to fulfill its mission and sustain it amid persecution is the Holy Spirit, who must be sought earnestly through prayer.

Peace and Power!

(Acts 9:31-43)

God reveals Himself and His power through His disciples so that people will come to know Jesus as Savior.

- 1) God brings peace to His disciples gathered together so that people will come to know Jesus as Savior. Acts 9:31

How are we living in the peace of the Holy Spirit in a way that would allow others to know Jesus as Savior?

- 2) God brings healing so that people will come to know Jesus as Savior. Acts 9:32-35

What healing from the Holy Spirit have you experienced that would allow others to know Jesus as Savior?

- 3) God brings His reflection into His disciples so that people will come to know Jesus as Savior. Acts 9:36-43

How are you using the power of the Holy Spirit in your life to reflect God in a way that would allow others to know Jesus as Savior?

So what? As I think about what we studied here today, how am I able to answer this question: *With God's help, what is one thing I can do this week to help another person know Jesus as Savior?*

Small Group Questions

- 1) **God brings peace to His disciples gathered together so that people will come to know Jesus as Savior. Acts 9:31**
There is a time of peace in the Church. This word is singular in this context—one Church at peace. It is not that the persecution has stopped—it is that the Holy Spirit as strengthened, allowed for a proper perspective of God, and has brought comfort. Talk about what a Church that is living and walking in the peace of the Spirit looks like, according to God's Word. How does individualism keep the Church from being a unit, living in peace? How does that keep people from knowing Jesus as Savior? Talk about the two quotes above. How does it impact your understanding of Church? Think about the section of the book of Acts we have looked at so far. How has this emphasis been revealed?
- 2) **God brings healing so that people will come to know Jesus as Savior. Acts 9:32-35**
It would be easy to get wrapped up in the healing and miss the point! The healing is amazing and many times we long for the healing to come. Consider all the people in Lydda who were not healed! Do you know of anyone who was healed after prayer? Talk about it in your group. What was the outcome of the healing? Once again, our text shows that the purpose is so that people will believe. Peter is being used by God to travel about the country and visit the saints. How do you think these visits might have promoted unity?
- 3) **God brings His reflection into His disciples so that people will come to know Jesus as Savior. Acts 9:36-43**
Peter raises a woman from the dead! Read Mark 5:40-43 and talk about the similarities. How was Peter reflecting Jesus in this healing? Consider as well, and perhaps even more importantly, Tabitha's reflection of Jesus! What do you think her spiritual gifts may have been? How did she use them to reflect Jesus? How did that impact the way people responded when she died? How did it shape their grieving? How does that affect your understanding of how the church is to be involved in areas of justice and meeting the needs of the less fortunate? How are you using the power of the Holy Spirit to meet the needs of those around you? How is that allowing others to know Jesus as Savior?
- 4) **Consider the "so what" question of the week.**
Share your answer. Pray for each other!
