DIGGING DEEPER

- **1.** READ Proverbs 3:9-10. How have you been taught by parents, teachers, pastors, and/or other churches about giving of our "first fruits"? What principles did you learn from them? Are there any patterns you still follow?
- **READ 2 Corinthians 9:6-15.** According to this passage, how generous should we be? What does Paul say our generosity will produce?
- **2.** READ Proverbs 2:4-5. Generosity and trust go hand in hand. God invites us to see all we have, as His, given to us, for His glory. What helps you recognize that you're making a choice to be generous out of trust, rather than fear?
- **READ Philippians 4:18-19**. Have you ever seen or personally experienced God's faithfulness in meeting the needs of those who chose to give generously?
- **READ James 1:5-8, 1 Timothy 6:6-10**. When asked to give, our tendency can be to withhold. What words do you find in these texts that comfort and encourage you to be generous?
- **3.** READ Proverbs 11:24, 13:11. Wise stewardship includes prudence, honesty, and faithfulness in the daily management of what God provides. In what ways do you see following God shape your financial decisions? Can you give an example?
