#### **CONSTRUCT HOMES**

#### **GUESS THE ITEMS**

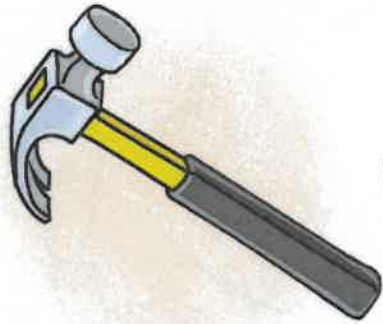
