

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As we near the end of our fiscal year, I want to thank all of you that have financially contributed to our church family. Over the last couple years, we've been trying to grow towards more consistent giving to alleviate some of the stress and pressure that our leaders feel late in the year, and you have responded! As we've gone through the year, we've been much closer to our pace goals. We hope and pray this generosity, and consistency will continue as we finish strong and head into a new year. We are grateful for all the people that give of their time, talents, and treasures.

Over the past year, it has been wonderful to welcome so many new people who now consider Gateway their home. Our mission, to

help people love and serve Jesus,

has been clear not only in our Sunday worship and preaching, but also in the vibrant ministries happening throughout the week. In a cultural moment when churches across North America are experiencing decline, it is encouraging to see how God continues to work through Gateway and use His people right here in our community.

In this booklet you will find extensive information on what is happening at Gateway with updates from our staff and some volunteers. On page 25 you will also find a detailed copy of the proposed 2026 Budget. There is much work, thought, and prayer that goes into the budget each

year and the process starts months in advance. Ministry leaders, and staff are consulted for the various ministry budgets, fixed costs like insurance, utilities, etc., are reviewed again, and a draft budget is formulated. It first goes to the Governing Council where it is reviewed, adjusted and was approved by that body. Following that approval, it was brought to full Council and was approved there on November 5th. Now, the 2026 Budget, is in front of you with a motion brought forward by the full Council of this Church. We take the finances very seriously and strive to balance keeping the budget as low as possible, while fairly compensating our staff and pastors, covering the fixed expenses of our beautiful campus, and supporting ministries that continue to see growth.

As a Council we are made up of three bodies: The Ministering Deacons, Ministering Elders, and the Governing Council. Each September, new members join. It is not always easy work, but I believe it to be rewarding work as each of these individuals serve the Church with the gifts, talents and skills that the Lord has entrusted them with.

You can find a full list of our elders and deacons, as well as our staff, on page 27. We invite you to see who they are and introduce yourself to them if you have not yet met them.

The church has always been a community of imperfect people following a perfect Savior, which means leadership and relationships can sometimes feel messy or challenging. Yet even in good times or challenging times, Scripture calls us to think the best of one another, extend grace, and trust that our leaders are seeking to serve Christ faithfully. When members and leaders work together in humility, mutual respect, and good faith, the church becomes a place where God shapes us, strengthens our unity, and continues His work through us, despite our imperfections.

With that in mind, we invite you to uphold all our Elders, Deacons, and staff in prayer – asking that the Lord would provide wisdom and grace; as well, we encourage you to look for opportunities to support, encourage, and bless them.

Diaconal work can mean many things; however, as deacons, we want to **show mercy**, promote and inspire **faithful steward-ship**, **hospitality**, and be an **encouragement to our neighbours**.

How do the deacons do this? There are various projects and programs, including food drives for Archway, distributing benevolence funds to those in need within our community, and supporting refugees and missionaries.

Missionaries may or may not be members of our congregation; yet, since we support them, they are considered part of fulfilling Gateway's values by being our hands and feet to the world. This year, the deacons have approved and encouraged the creation of the **Our Missionaries** page on Gateway's website. The page is a resource where you can find information about the work of our **six** missionaries' ministries.

We see **Howard & Jannie Johnson (NAIM)**, who are involved in working among the indigenous peoples in BC by hosting Supper Clubs and providing opportunities for people to learn to trust Jesus, even in the face of pushback in the community. **Leslie Arends (Esther School)** is working in Zambia, providing Christian education within the Zambian educational system. **Monique Mattatal (GAiN)** is involved in projects to provide water for villages in Benin and Tanzania. **Tyler Couperus (GAiN)** focuses on disaster relief and preparedness in various countries worldwide. **Lianne Tuin (Adventures in Missions)** is discipling and guiding teams and is involved in helping communities in the countries they visit. **Jack DeKroon (P2C)** is busy gathering supplies and constructing churches in Haiti.

The webpage keeps us up to date on what is happening in their ministries and provides us with ways to pray and be a blessing and encouragement to our missionaries, as well as their communities.

When I drive my kids to school, we recite "*The Shema*," first in Hebrew, then in English. Yes, my kids recite it in Hebrew. Yes, they're cool. Yes, they're pastors' kids. I do this because of the words that follow: **These commandments...are to be on your hearts. Impress them on your children.** I know that my kids will face a day full of decisions - how to treat teachers and classmates; whether to step in when someone is bullied; whether to apply themselves. As they face those decisions, I want to instill this vision: Do it with all you've got, for the glory of God!

inviting you to consider *why* you do anything at all. Placed together, **Shema Kavanah**, paints a vision for life: **With all you've got (Shema), for the**

glory of God (Kavanah)! I want to live my life that way!

As dad, it is my calling to impress these truths into daily life, when we walk, talk, rise, and sit. But this calling extends beyond parenting. Jesus repeats the Shema in Matthew 22, inviting all of us, married or single, with kids or without, to build our lives around it. As we lean into this "Shema Kavanah" life, our focus for the year becomes clear: to grow as a people who practice daily, life-shaping habits of discipleship, rooted in **God's Word**, nurtured in **community**, and extended through **mission**.

Friends, as you read the ministry reports in this booklet, you'll see God shaping us in these ways. From the newborns in our nursery to our vibrant senior's ministry, God is discipling His people. Please pause and pray for each ministry as you read. Here are just a few things I invite you to join us in praying for in 2026.

A Vision for Sticky, Lasting Faith. As a church, we boldly aspire for faith to be "sticky" for our children and youth. Research from the Fuller Youth Institute highlights a sobering trend: 40–50% of active high-school seniors drift from faith after graduation. We want to buck that trend! It also identifies three practices that powerfully help faith endure: (1) Parents modeling weekly worship and simple, consistent faith practices at home, (2) Intergenerational relationships in the church, (3) The "5:1 ratio," five caring adults investing in every young person.

Thus, in 2026, we aspire to grow in these areas by:

- **1. Equipping parents as primary disciplers.** Resourcing families so spiritual habits take root at home
- **2. Build toward the 5:1 ratio.** Surrounding every teen with caring adults: parents, small-group leaders, mentors, and invested members.
- **3. Deepening worship-first integration for kids and teens.** Children and teens regularly leading in worship.
- **4. Resourcing parents with simple, meaningful tools.** Weekly conversation starters, family devotion guides, training nights.
- **5. Strengthening intergenerational rhythms.** Serving opportunities, meals, shared experiences—practices that weave our lives together.

All of this is about helping faith take root, grow strong, and endure.

Thank You, and We Need Your Help! This past year, I have seen God at work through you. If we listed every volunteer role, the number would exceed 400—a remarkable picture of generosity. Thank you! Your joyful service is one of the strongest testimonies to God's work among us. This year we are building new teams around hospitality, prayer, and event planning. You will hear more in the weeks ahead. For now, please pray that the Lord brings the right people to these important roles.

Deep Gratitude. I want to express profound thanks to our Council and staff. They serve with prayerful diligence and humility. It is a privilege to serve alongside them. Their dedication, prayerfulness, and joyful service amaze me. They show up week after week with a sincere desire to see God's Kingdom work expand, and they do so with energy and joy. Gateway, please continue to bless and encourage them.

A Personal Note: Sabbatical 2026. Lord willing, this summer I will take my first sabbatical—a time to refresh the heart, sharpen the mind, and renew the soul. It will include prayer retreats, family reconnection, and, God willing, a site visit to Israel in preparation for a future church trip. If all goes well, I hope to lead many of you there in 2027. Thank you for praying for me and for the elders walking with me through this process.

Finally, from Julie and me. Thank you! This congregation is our family. We feel loved, supported, prayed for, and uplifted by you. It is a joy to serve as your pastor. I bless and thank God for each of you. Gateway, let's continue to love the Lord with all our heart, soul, and strength, and teach the next generation to do the same, **with all we've got, for the glory of God!**

Shortly after we started attending Gateway, we were invited to join the First Impressions team. We were especially grateful for the warm welcome we received, coming in right after Covid. As we read this statement, we can see at least a few themes start to emerge that are integral for our church's services of congregational worship.

The first theme is our aim to help people to **love Jesus**, a goal that must surely involve revealing who He is and what He does, and through that to develop a love for Jesus that is informed by our growing understanding of God and the love He has for His people, expressed most fully in the giving of His one and only Son, Jesus the Saviour. And so, Jesus taught us that the greatest commandment is this:

You shall LOVE THE LORD your God with all your HEART and with all your SOUL and with all your MIND.

Matthew 22:36 | ESV

Taking this scripture passage seriously, at Gateway we aim to craft services of worship that participate with this high and holy calling, as we learn to love the Lord with our hearts and minds through the songs of worship that we sing together and as we proclaim truths of scripture over one another in our corporate services of worship. We see to this, at least in part, by incorporating *psalms*, *hymns* and *spiritual songs* in our services that proclaim and actually teach us about our great God, the creator and master of the universe; about the realities of our sin, and our great need of a Saviour; and about God's grace that is ours through the redeeming work of Christ.

The second theme that emerges from our church's mission statement is that we aim to help people to **serve Jesus**. One way that we seek to fulfill this calling is to *engage*, *equip* and *mobilize* gifted people from the body of Christ to serve in the context of the Gateway Worship ministry team. I count it a special joy to be able to work with such a large number of people in the Gateway Worship ministry, each of whom has been created by God and given gifts and a servant heart to share in the work of ministry together. For this group, made up of our Production Team, Worship Bands and the Gateway Choir & Orchestra— it is a privilege and a passion to serve by sharing out of our gifts.

For we are God's handiwork, created in Christ Jesus TO DO good WORKS, which God prepared in advance for us TO DO.

Recently we have seen a number of new families and individuals coming to Gateway, each man and woman among them having been gifted in various ways. 
VOLUNTEER HIGHLIGHT Joel Huizing Gateway Worship

We talk often of our eight values, and the one that continually stands out to me, is the one that outlines how we aspire to be a community of faith where everyone is **known**, **loved**, **and accounted for**.

through my interactions with you all that you all care so deeply for each

other, you meet for coffee with friends, you invite guests for lunch, you check in on our elderly, you carpool other kids, *and so much more!*

To **know** everyone, means that as soon as someone interacts with our church at a weekend worship service, being a guest at a Life Group or Youth night, or a first timer to Coffee Break, we desire to learn how God has led our lives to intersect at this very point. But it's more than getting to know our guests, it's about us as a community continually seeking ways to be a community of faith. Worship services, Life Groups, Fall Festivals, Weekends of Service, Ice Skating, Seniors at Krause Berry Farms, are all ways that we strive to get to know each other better!

To **love** everyone, means that we'll care for our whole community, members and non-members alike! As everyone, in the Lord's family need and desire spiritual and life care. So, we set ourselves up to do just that. Our staff, Life Group Leaders, Care Team Leaders, and Ministering Elders, all seek to model this love for our whole community, as we connect with our church family on a regularly basis.

To **account** for everyone, means that to the best of our abilities, we watch all these relationships and interactions. From monitoring attendance

in our Life Groups, to tracking the conversations we have with our guests, to receiving reports of meaningful connections that our Care

Team Leaders and Ministering Elders are making.

So much of my work as Pastor of Congregational Care, has to do with this value. I enjoy regularly being in touch with our Seniors, in phone calls, visits in homes, in coffee shops, care homes, and by hospital beds. It's truly an honor to be welcomed as a pastor in those places. I also enjoy working alongside Pastor Justin to put together our Sermon Guides for our Life Groups, and its included Leadership Material.

Another aspect of my work is following up with our guests. Ivonne Grabowski, a recent guest who has been reading through materials like "Our Faith" (a booklet that includes the Heidelberg Catechism, and Belgic Confession), and "Reformed" (by Bob DeMoor, who writes about the core tenants of our Reformed faith), wrote to me about her growing faith:

It's great to see and be convicted of so many thoughts that I didn't even know I had, as well as examining the underpinnings that had shaped the way I've been doing church and worship my whole life.

As we pursue pastoral interactions with our members and guests, we see the Lord not just upholding His church, but we also see Him growing His church! Both elements are vital, and very special parts of ministry at Gateway. It's been very exciting to see that the Lord is drawing His people to Himself through our church family! And all together, we are discovering just how passionate we are about how we all belong, body, and soul, to our faithful saviour, Jesus Christ.

In all this, I truly see the Lord caring for His whole flock. I love opening up the book of Ezekiel as I have the opportunity to lead the Benedictions in our services and to share a little about God's passion for His people who often feel lost when apart from their Shepherd. I share these words, as a paraphrase of Ezekiel 34:30-31,

You shall know that I am the Lord, your God, and that with the fellowship of believers, you are My sheep, you are My people, and I will care for, provide for, and nurture every single one of you.

I will bless you, and I will protect you. I will smile upon you, and I will extend My grace to you. I will show you favor, and I will grant you My peace. AMEN.

That's my prayer for us all as we go into a new year of ministry together, that we would see and experience the Lord going ahead of us – because after all, Gateway Community Church – is first and foremost, the Lord's Church. It's not ours. It's His. And He will do with it, what He desires - and it's my sense that He intends to care for His people within it, and to bring us more people to love.

ing the Gospel and discipleship. Teaching the Word of God at our Summit youth nights (grades 9-12) on Thursdays has quickly become one of my favorite times of the week. The

youth pile in, laughing, or running to the nine-square, sitting in the corner with some friends, grabbing some snacks. They all wait until Nevaeh starts the games and Matt leads the worship with some volunteer Youth. We then move to the teaching where we are moving through Galatians - Ephesians - Colossians. We then finish the nights off with some small group discussions!! Many of us Christians will use the term "Mountain Top Experience" to describe a spiritual moment that was particularly powerful or meaningful. The goal is that Summit Youth nights can be that for the youth.

Getting to teach youth about God, Scripture, and the life of the church is both important and a blessing; doing that every week is both a *weighty responsibility* and a *joyful experience*. In my preparations I find myself wondering how the truth of the passage we are studying will help these youth? Will they care about it? Will this passage change their hearts? Will this push them to grow closer to God? But after the teaching, when they come back from their small groups, I hear all of these beautiful stories from the leaders; about the wonderful conversations they had in their groups. I see their hearts wrestling with the passages and topics. The questions they ask are earnest and sincere. **Our youth genuinely want to learn and grow to understand more about God.**

The youth are also crazy! With almost 140 youth registered and a little less than that each Thursday we are having a loud, chaotic, wonderful time! The volume in the Multi Purpose Room is deafening, but many of these youths are enjoying themselves. We have youth volunteering as

worship leaders. They are nervous but they want to be there and lead their peers in worshiping the Lord. As a ministry leader it is everything to see them desire God. When I teach and involve the youth by asking questions, I get a lot of good answers and further questions that we get to discuss, and they want to participate and be a part of the conversations. One youth asked, "How is God outside of time?" and another asked "Where is God if He made the universe, is there a place where He is?" The Youth of Gateway are looking for God. They want Him, seek Him, desire Him, and are moving towards Him.

Our youth would not be able to seek Him in the way they do, and I would not be able to teach them in any effective way if it wasn't for the ministry of volunteer youth leaders. Our volunteer leaders are not just good servants of Christ but a necessary part of discipleship. They pour into our students every ounce of their love. They walk with them through difficult and good times, through simple and complex questions. They are able to spend more building relationships in ways that Nevaeh or I, cannot with 140 youth. The fruit is evident! When the leaders arrive at Summit they are surrounded by their groups. The youth leaders are not just chaperones, but they are adults who mentor these youth towards Christ.

Summit Youth nights are led by Nevaeh, a lot of volunteer leaders, and myself; without the support of Gateway's staff, we would not be where we are! God has placed great people to lead His church, and we, Nevaeh and I, desire their discipleship and mentorship. Each member of our staff, Justin, Adam, Jason, Evan, Shena, and Carol, have endlessly supported and supplied us with anything we need to lead Summit and EDGE. We were welcomed onto the staff team with open arms with gratuitous levels of support and love.

As we think about all of the meetings, prayers, discussion, and all of the wrestling through how this ministry should be run in continuity with scripture and the CRC ministry ideals, as well as our specific context at Gateway, our fellow staff have modeled for us how to do ministry with the youth by being such beacons of Christ's light and love.

This ministry has been a blessing not just to participate in, but one of the greatest blessings of my life. And I thank God that I was asked by Him to participate in it. I see youth being loved by God and His church, and I see youth responding in wonder and love to their God.

EDGE Youth (grades 6-8), and I can truly say that God is moving in this ministry. Every Wednesday night, around 100 preteens pour the doors, full of energy, laughter, and curiosity, ready to expe-

through the doors, full of energy, laughter, and curiosity, ready to experience all that EDGE has to offer. The name "EDGE" stands for *Every Day God Encounters*, and week after week, *that's exactly what we see happening*.

Though EDGE is only an hour and a half each week, that time is intentionally focused on what matters most: **studying God's Word, building Christ-centered community, and helping students live missionally** in their everyday lives. We begin each night by creating space for connection through games, laughter, and shared experiences that show our students that *they belong*. But everything points towards the moment when we open Scripture together. Our teaching time is centered on knowing who God is, understanding His character, and learning how to follow Jesus in practical, tangible ways. After teaching, we move into small groups where walls come down, friendships form, and faith begins to take root.

Working with middle schoolers is an adventure in the best way possible. Conversations can shift from "Guess what I had for lunch?" to deep theological questions that catch you completely off guard, which is what makes EDGE so special. These students are curious, bold, and honest. One night, a Grade 6 student asked me, "If someone is a really good person but doesn't follow Jesus, will they still go to heaven?" Questions like that remind me why this ministry matters. Our role isn't to have every answer, but to walk alongside students as they wrestle with Scripture, explore their doubts, and discover who Jesus is for themselves. We desire small groups to be a place where students feel safe to ask, wonder, and grow; a place where the Word of God becomes alive and personal.

I'm continually amazed by the team of leaders God has provided for this ministry. Our core team, a group of four veteran leaders, has been an incredible gift. As both Josh and I stepped into new leadership roles this year, they offered steady support through wisdom, encouragement, and prayer. They have helped us navigate transitions, strengthen systems, and dream about where God is leading EDGE for the year. Alongside them, our fifteen youth leaders faithfully show up each week to guide small groups, build relationships, and pour into the lives of our preteens.

These leaders are more than volunteers. They are mentors, encouragers, and examples of what it looks like to follow Jesus daily. They serve with joy, patience, and creativity, whether that means calming a chaotic group, cleaning up spilled snacks, or offering a listening ear to a student who's having a tough night. Their presence shapes this ministry in ways that go far beyond the program itself. They live missionally by investing intentionally in these students, modeling Christlike love, and helping each youth see that they are known, valued, and loved by God.

As I reflect on these past few months, I'm overwhelmed with gratitude for what God has done and for the people He is using to do it. Our prayer is that these moments will lead to lifelong discipleship as students continue encountering Jesus in everyday life.

To the parents and families who entrust us with your children each week, *thank you*. It is a privilege to partner with you in guiding your kids as they discover who Jesus is and what it means to follow Him. Director of Chrildren's Ministries

God invites His people to listen to His teaching and join Him reaching the next generation. Imagine Israel singing Psalm 78:4,

We will not hide them from their children, but tell to the coming generation the glorious deeds of the LORD, and His might, and the wonders that He has done.

We are not to keep the truth for ourselves, but are called to share it with the next generation. The "we" in verse 4 is not just parents. While parents are the primary disciplers of the children, it doesn't fall exclusively on their shoulders.

We have our goal as a church body to teach truth to little hearts and to model the gospel community. We do this by extending multiple opportunities to hear the gospel from a young age from nursery, story hour and to Kids church (age 3-grade 3), to GEMS and to Cadets (grades 3-5), not only for our church members, but also extending the mission to children within our local church community.

We have 60 different children coming on Sunday mornings between the ages of 0-8. We have 45 GEMS signed up this year, with 25 of those girls being from our community. Cadets has 32 boys signed up, with 17 of them from the community. These are incredible testaments to the gospel being proclaimed, as it continues in Psalm 78:6-7,

So the next generation would know [the commands], even the children yet to be born, and they in turn would tell their children. Then they would put their trust in God and would not forget His deeds.

Recently, I had the privilege of attending a gathering for Children's Ministry Directors in the Christian Reformed Church to explore what parents in today's day and age need for support from their local church to raise disciples from early development. How can we strengthen and encourage parents to raise their children in practical and spiritual ways that point them to Christ? How do we partner and come alongside families in providing spiritual guidance, showing that all areas of life point to our Creator? The data is being gathered from numerous congregations and conclusions are being drawn to say this: parents want ways to incorporate simple, daily habits into their lives, and would love to find meaningful ways to find community and develop relationships within the church. What's the biggest hurdle? Time and consistency.

Recently, Pastor Justin gave a sermon from Proverbs 3 and 9 (November 2, 2025), encouraging parents to begin with the Bible. Open it. Include it in your daily habits. Talk about it with your children. Are you reading the Bible with your children? In the seasons ahead, we hope to provide resources that help you find simple ways to make spiritual disciplines a part of your daily habits as a family.

We understand time and consistency are also a challenge when it comes to volunteering. We are so thankful for all our volunteers in our Kids ministries who help teach and equip our young ones to learn the gospel message. Did you know we have over 100 volunteers in Kids Ministries? We see that these intergenerational relationships have lasting effect, caring for the children beyond their school years, and helping kids feel loved and accounted for, not just because they are a student, but because they belong to our faithful Saviour, Jesus Christ.

I look forward to learning more through our children, our ministries, our volunteers and through the network of Children's ministry leaders, to try and embellish the partnership between parents and the church, so that you know we are here with you and for you, and for your children, and your children's children. May our God be praised for generations to come!





Infrastructure Development Task Force In the last year I've enjoyed working with a group of volunteers as part of the Infrastructure Development Task Force to review the long-term management of the church campus' buildings and property. On the surface, this

work may not seem to be that missional, but **God has given us this incredible church campus for us to use as a tool for growing His kingdom** through corporate worship, providing church ministries & programs, and leading community events and activities. All this is for us to be a light for the Lord, in our community. When you stop to think about all of the meetings, events, and activities that occur in and outside of our facility, we see that it is truly a gift that God has given to us!

With this gift of the campus and facilities, comes costs that include normal maintenance but also repairs and replacement. Over the last year, we met each month, to review an in-depth list of every single component of our entire property and facility, and then we assessed when each component would need replacing and how much we expected it to cost. Engineering and architectural drawings were scanned and digitized, and contractors and other specialists were approached to give their opinions on the lifespan of everything from paint on the walls to HVAC units.

God says to diligently manage the assets that have been placed in our care:

Be sure you know the condition of your flocks, give careful attention to your herds; for riches do not endure forever, and a crown is not secure for all generations. Governing Council formed this group to assess the potential large expenses that could occur in then next 30 years on the church campus, including building and property components that may need to be repaired or replaced.

The goal was to have long-term visibility that would allow planning for our church to start saving funds now in preparation for repairs that may happen 10, 20 or 30 years from now.

The result was a model that outlined every major component, such as building roofs, furnaces, paint and flooring etc., and how much approximately Gateway will need to save each year to meet the funding requirement. The annual saving will minimize the need to suddenly raise funds for unexpected failures in the campus buildings.


I am thankful that God has given us knowledgeable volunteers who used many hours of their time to work together to assess the campus and build this detailed model. Most of the volunteers have experience in the construction, development, or finance aspects of industry that allowed their talents to be leveraged for this specific project.

We expect that this project will be reviewed every 5 years to ensure that the planning stays up-to-date and key components' lifespans continue to be reviewed for accuracy. With God's blessings, our Gateway Community Church campus will continue to benefit our church family, both its members and guests, as well as our neighbouring community for years to come.

This is a key element of our mission to help people to love and serve Jesus.


