III. Addressing our problems vs. 4

(1 John 1:9, Mark 11:25, 1 Corinthians 10:13, Matthew 26:41, Ephesians 6:11, James 4:7, 2 Corinthians 10:4-6)

IV. Keeping at it vs 5-13

(Luke 22:41-42, James 4:13-15, Romans 8:28, James 1:17, Romans 8:32)
