## Consistory



The Consistory has been diligently working to amend the 2024 budget. This year's budget has been a huge challenge, as we have very little room to cut expenses, and projected income falls short of expenses. Last year (2023) we saw some offering/giving earmarked for benevolence. Benevolence funding cannot be used for general operating expenses. As we budget based on last year's figures, we will probably not be able to present a balanced budget. Consistory hopes to finalize the proposed budget on Monday, February 12. Once a recommendation has been

made, copies will be made available and a date set for a congregational meeting.

Consistory is also reviewing changes to the Endowment Fund By-Laws, as recommended by the Endowment Committee. If approved by the Consistory, those changes will also come before the congregation at the next congregational meeting.

Please remember the Consistory meetings are open meetings and we welcome your comments and attendance.

#### Meet the New Kid on the Block --- Pastor Schaun Myers

Greetings, and meet our new interim, Pastor Schaun. We asked him if we could introduce him to our church family via an article in The Voice. Without hesitation he said, "Sure, sounds like fun." This may have been his first mistake. Seriously, we hear that he plays well with others, likes to have fun, is a team player, and in his own words, "has a squirrel mentality and is easily distracted." A perfect fit for St. Thomas!

Actually, he is quite accomplished and has dedicated his life to Christ and going about the Father's work in various mission fields; whether that be the PA National Guard, teaching a Sunday school class, delivering a Bible-based sermon, or going about daily life. His heart is for The Lord. A perfect fit for St. Thomas!

Born in Ohio into a pastor's family, Pastor Schaun grew up mostly in Cincinnati, which is still his favorite town. He attended a small Christian college in Tennessee where he met his wife, Darlene. She was born in Brooklyn. Funny how God brought a NYC native and a farm boy from Ohio to Tennessee to meet and fall in love.

They married in 1987 and moved to Chicago to further their education. Pastor earned an MDIV and a masters in Church History, while Darlene studied for her masters in Christian Ed. Their first daughter, Jess, was born at the end of their time in Chicago in 1992.

The first church that they served, beginning in July 1992, was in Rowes Run, PA, an old coal patch town. They remained in Fayette County for five and a half years. Their second daughter, Britt, was born in 1994.

The family moved to Reading in 1997 to pastor St. James Church in West Reading. Their third daughter, Brooke, was born at the Reading Hospital the following year. Pastor and Darlene still live in Kenhorst. In 2003, after 9/11, Pastor Schaun joined the PA National Guard as a chaplain (Bruce Farrell recruited him). He served a cavalry squadron for 12 years, went to New Orleans with the unit after Katrina, then to Iraq in 2009. He pastored St. James until 2008 when he began serving full-time in the Guard.

After Iraq Pastor Schaun came home and served as the interim pastor at St. James while they searched for a pastor, and since then he has completed many military duties. He spent a year in Jordan in 2018, managing the religious support for all US forces stationed there,

and was blessed to baptize over 100 soldiers (and three Russian women) in the Jordan River. He truly considers the PA National Guard as his mission field. Darlene homeschooled the girls until they reached high school, and then she began working in Governor Mifflin School District, specifically with special needs students. Pastor Schaun says, "She is outstanding at what she does, and can reach the most troubled kids."

He has been a woodworker/contractor for most of his years in ministry. He enjoys repairing/refinishing antiques and loves building models of tanks. Pastor Schaun has won some awards and has been published in modeler's magazines. He loves classic rock, Andy Griffith and cartoons.

Darlene is a talented artist and loves creating things. She also is the adventurer in the family in that she loves hiking, camping, and travelling. She collects books and animals and has had many odd pets (including a skunk and a pig). Hmm. We'll have to ask her about that sometime.

Their daughters are all grown:




Try this chilly new take on a healthy snack.

- Parchment paper


#### What you do:
