istraction and dysfunction become major factors during times of distress. When distress rises to the point where it consumes our thoughts and emotions our focus and view on the totality of life becomes narrowed and strained. This can be a good thing or a bad thing. The example of Daniel in the lions' den show us that a narrowed and strained view can be a good thing. Daniel knew that his love and loyalty to the Lord might cost his life. Yet,

he carried on his daily life as usual and with openness. He did not try to hide his faithfulness to the Lord and this caused him to be apprehended and sentenced to be thrown into the lions' den. He did not fight against that determination, but rather he sought to turn to the Lord to give him the comfort and strength to face the upcoming crisis.



He was then taken to the lions' den and thrown in. The most compelling part of this story is that as unavoidable and as dominant as the lions and their obvious threat to his life. Daniel chose to narrow and strain his focus, not on the lions (the very present problem), but turned his eyes up to the Lord (the prevailing and ultimate solution). Keeping his eyes and his heart focused on the Lord was vital and he was determined not to allow the lions to cause him to get distracted. For if he allowed this distraction to take place, then dysfunction would be the next disastrous inevitable result.

When the consuming focus is on the problem (the lions), then terrible fear, in fact petrifying fear, will be the disastrous end result. Panic and flight usually keep close company to these kinds of disaster. Panic can and does cause incomprehensible actions that cause one to seek for every ounce of energy to flee the impending harm that is on him. Fleeing may seem like the best and only hope, but many times fleeing is the worst solution. In fact, fleeing, because of panic and flight, can cause you to miss the best and sometimes only solution.

In Daniel's situation, when he was caught in continual faithful prayer, he was probably getting his and instructions and his strength to carry out God's righteous



and holy will. He then continued in attitude of prayer an and submission to the Lord as he was apprehended and then finally as he was thrown into the lions' den. This attitude of prayer and surrender obviously continued as he had to

face the lions. However, with this foundation of prayer and

surrender completely entrenching his life, Daniel was able to see the complete will of the Lord accomplished and not just that the lions were taken care of. For upon coming out of the lions' den he was able to see King Darius declare in Daniel 6:26-27 (NLT) ²⁶"I decree that everyone throughout my kingdom should tremble with fear before the God of Daniel. For he is the living God, and he will endure forever. His

kingdom will never be destroyed, and his rule will never end. 27 He rescues and saves his people; he performs miraculous signs and wonders in the heavens and on earth. He has rescued Daniel from the power of the lions."



In Daniel's life, the saving of his life was not the main focus. Daniel's focus was on accomplishing and fulfilling God's will. Yes, it came at a high cost, but it was because the stakes were high. In this case, Daniel's faithful and disciplined life caused King Darius to turn and declare that the Lord God Almighty was and is the only true God. Daniel would probably not have been able to accomplish and fulfill God's will if he had yielded to the distractions and dysfunctions that were screaming for his complete and full attention.

In our lives, if we yield to the distractions and dysfunctions that surround us during our times of crisis, then we could be missing the best and only solution/s. We also should be looking at the broader scheme of things and that more importantly, that by yielding to the distractions and dysfunctions this would cause God's will from being accomplished. You see, the greater the costs for following Jesus probably means that the stakes are greater. Fulfilling and accomplishing God's will in our lives is not easy and it will take a disciplined and faithful life that refuses the distractions and dysfunctions that comes with crisis filled situations.

When our backs against the wall and fear and flight screams

•Southern Cross Project (SCP), East Asian Peoples - "Please, Father, move the mountains that are keeping Chinese tourists, students, and workers from knowing you. The mountains of physical and spiritual sickness are no match for your strength. Call Chinese believers around the world to pray, and show them that the fields are ready. Call them to witnesses with joy about the treasure they have found in you. Call many sowers into your diaspora fields. Fill us with your life and joy for the sowing. Strengthen our weakness to make your name great."

•South Asian Peoples - Thank you for praying for the teenage boy who was violently attacked in his hometown earlier this month. This young man, who has now died, is worshiping at the feet of his Savior. His faith is now sight, his victory won. He knew that turning to Christ would be costly. Neighbors, friends, his entire community would likely turn against him. A common print hanging in believers' homes in South Asia is of Daniel in the lions' den. This image and the story behind it resonate with them. This young man left behind his mute idols and ran to the one true God. He chose Jesus. Pray for his family. Pray that the evil one won't get a foothold in their lives nor throughout the church in South Asia. Pray that the death of this teenager will be a catalyst for revival, renewed boldness, and passionate gospel sharing. Pray that his attackers will come to Jesus, perhaps through the testimony of his family. Pray for the church in South Asia to fix their eyes on Christ and throw off anything that hinders them from pursuing Him. Pray that the testimony of the church in these very days will be used by God to draw many to Himself.

•People of Central Taiwan - Pray for central Taiwan churches as they continue to re-establish in-house worship after Taiwan's two months of soft lockdown. Pray for attendance to grow with a new fervor, and that believers will relish worshiping together once again. Pray for a new sense of urgency to reach out to lost family members, friends, coworkers, and strangers with the gospel of Christ. Central Taiwan's approximately 5 million people desperately need God's showers of blessings to fall, saturating hearts and minds with His mercy and grace, leading them to salvation.

•Mebo of Laos (MEE-boh) - The Mebo people are trained to do only what they are told to do. Taking initiative and engaging in critical thinking not only are not taught, but they are also, in many ways, discouraged. The Mebo are simply to believe what the authorities and their teachers tell them. This thinking crosses over into church thinking, as well. They are expected to leave the teaching and evangelism to the "paid professionals." At a small school owned and operated by Christians from another country, there is an effort underway to change that thinking and help the local Christians take responsibility for the discipleship and evangelism of their own country. Small Bible study groups are assigned one of the more mature local Christians, who is then given the responsibility of leading the small group study. These leaders meet once a week to discuss study plans, leadership principles, and ways to reach out to the local nonbelievers. Progress is slow, however. Pray for the Mebo, asking that they will break through cultural barriers for the sake of the gospel.

Kansas City has become increasingly multi-cultural in recent years. A recent festival drew area residents who have moved here from more than 60 other nations.

Price and Arrica want to reach all of them for Christ— wherever they are from.

The new church has done well. They started with a launch team of 35 people — but that number tripled within a few months.

Price says they're eager to see what God is doing to do with them. He says they disciple new believers who will disciple more new believers.

Let's ask God to bless this new church and watch over Price and Arrica.
