# college


Alliance Christian Fellowship: A church for students, led by students.

## **Trustees**

Our Trustees had a productive and impactful year in 2024, dedicated to caring for the facility and grounds with a heart for good stewardship and Kingdom work. One of the largest projects undertaken this year was the installation of a new roof over the oldest part of the building, ensuring the continued integrity of our space for ministry.

The team also extended their care beyond the church by helping neighbors through several service projects, embodying the spirit of community and outreach. Meeting monthly, the Trustees worked diligently to complete numerous projects both inside and outside the facility.

In addition to physical improvements, the team focused on financial stewardship by reviewing service contracts to identify areas where costs could be reduced. They've already begun implementing changes that will save the church money. Research and progress were also made on enhancing our video surveillance capabilities, and the team is in the process of upgrading the door access system to improve building security.

We are grateful for the Trustees' hard work and dedication, which helps maintain an effective home base for Kingdom work.

## **Board of Administration**

This year, the Board of Administration worked together to steward our church's resources and support the ministries of SCAC with care and intentionality. Each month, we monitored the church's finances, ensuring they remained strong and aligned with our mission. In collaboration with ministry leaders, we developed line-item amounts for the 2025 SCAC budget, a process that allowed us to align our plans with God's vision for the upcoming year.

We also focused on improving internal structures, including reviewing and revising the SCAC employee handbook and addressing other HR matters. ## missions & outreach

Teach, reach, and send disciples to share Christ's love, celebrating the many lives transformed by His grace.

#### Global Connections

In 2024, we were honored to host several International Workers throughout the year, including Bob & Cheryl Fugate, who reconnected with our church during the Spring Missions Focus. Bob's ministry journey began at SCAC, making this visit especially meaningful. We also welcomed their daughter and son-in-law, Tim & Sarah Shutes, who are church planting in NYC, and Gerry & Juliette Peña, serving in Newberry, PA, during the Regional Mission Rally. The rally's keynote was delivered by District Superintendent Nate Howard. In the fall, Mike & Elissa Picconatto joined us from Berlin, Germany, reconnecting with the short-term mission team we sent earlier in the year and experiencing Harvest Fest alongside our community.

## **Mission Trips**

Our church sent two mission teams this year—one to Kenya and one to Berlin. In Kenya, eight individuals trained local Christian leaders and volunteers to run a sports camp, which was met with great enthusiasm and success. Meanwhile, our Berlin team, composed of eight SCAC members and two from Common Place Church, explored how the Alliance is working to reach Europe's post-Christian, post-modern population.

#### **Local Outreach**

This year marked the second year of our Conversational English Classes, with attendance doubling from the first year. Under the guidance of Katy McIver, our newly hired Director of Multicultural Ministries, the program welcomed a variety of new people groups.

## **Community Engagement**

We hosted the Feed My Starving Children (FMSC) FoodPack, which brought together 562 volunteers to pack 139,968 meals and raise over \$45,000. Our Wood for Good initiative provided over 10 cords of firewood to those in need. Additionally, we welcomed the broader community through events like Touch-a-Truck and by providing our facility for various groups.

Through every initiative, event, and connection, God has faithfully led our efforts, and we celebrate the incredible work He is doing locally and globally through SCAC's Missions & Outreach ministry.





## **GENERAL FUND OPERATIONS**

Giving to the *General Fund*, which supports all aspects of ministry operations, staff support, building operations, and required debt service on the mortgage, totaled \$1,367,525 for 2024. This exceeded *General Fund* spending of \$1,361,928 by \$5,597, which included a leadership-approved additional allocation of \$50,000 toward the mortgage from general fund reserves. Notably, full-year giving for 2024 was \$11,984 higher than the budgeted amount and as of December 31, 2024, our *General Fund* reserve was \$268,630.

### **OUTREACH/MISSIONS GIVING**

The generous giving through the church continues to have a profound impact: Giving to the *Great Commission Fund*, *Mission Trips*, the *Deacons Fund*, the *Samaria Fund*, the *Persecuted Church*, *Disaster Relief*, *ACF (PSU Campus Ministry)*, *Nittany Christian School*, and other externally-focused initiatives totaled \$304,565 in 2024, a substantial increase from \$272,000 in 2023. This is truly tremendous giving toward outreach and highlights the ongoing generosity of our community in supporting our mission to serve others.

#### FAITH FORWARD CAPITAL CAMPAIGN

Through the ongoing and faithful support of the Faith Forward Campaign, along with the principal portion of our monthly mortgage payments, we were able to reduce the mortgage by \$459,739 in 2024. This has brought the mortgage balance down to \$707,445 as of December 31, 2024. Continued giving to this campaign will enable the ministry to completely eliminate this debt in the near future, further accelerating the growth of our ministry efforts. We are excited as we approach the final stages of this journey, and together, we can REDUCE THAT DEBT and expand the impact of our mission!
