Day 3

7) According to verse 2, what has David seen and beheld?

8) What statement is made in verse 3? What do you think it means?

9) The psalmist says his soul is satisfied. Where do you find your satisfaction? What do you thirst and long for in the wilderness?

10) What does David do on his bed?

11) Where do our minds tend to go in the watches of the night?

Day 4

12) What does the psalmist say results when he remembers God and meditates on Him?

13) What do you think the shadow of His wings provides?

14) In verse 9, who is holding who?

15) What or who are your greatest enemies? Read Ephesians 6:12.

16) What will happen to those who are seeking to harm David?

Day 5

17) Who is the king and what is he able to do?

18) Has worshipping God when you are in crisis helped? Why or why not?

19) How and when have you personally seen God's glory displayed? How would you define His glory?
