Deaconess Joy Prim

Deaconess Joy Prim is a United Methodist missionary with the General Board of Global Ministries serving as a welfare case officer for migrant domestic workers. She is based at the Mission for Migrant Workers (MFMW) at St. John's Cathedral in Hong Kong, China. She started her mission service in 2020.



Founded in 1981, MFMW remains committed to its mission to support migrant workers in crisis and empower them to regain dignity while striving to build the recognize of migrant domestic workers as an integral part of multicultural and inclusive Hong Kong society. Migrant domestic workers remain one of the most vulnerable groups in Hong Kong, left out of many social protections. MFMW has seen increase in migrant workers seeking their services. As a missionary, Deaconess Prim provides stability and continuity to the mission's social justice work.

Deaconess Joy is originally from Western North Carolina. She grew up here at Yadkinville UMC. She has been a member of United Women in Faith since the age of 12, able to recite the purpose by heart before she could read chapter books. The UWF laid for caring for issues of women, youth and children in our local communities and around the world shaped her foundation in her calling. She first served as Young Adult Missionary Mission Intern (now Global Mission Fellow) in Hong Kong in 2011 with MFMW and in Los Angeles where she continued working with primarily Filipino migrant workers around issues of wage theft, and human trafficking.

She was welcomed into the order of Deaconess and Home Missioner in May 2020 and finally consecrated as a Deaconess, in May 2022 at UWF Assembly. She was commissioned as a missionary that same year. Both delayed because of the COVID-19 pandemic. Deaconess Joy's call is shaped by her understandings of the early church that weren't so much about liturgies and formalities but about building community, finding ways to support each other and living our faith in action.
