
# A message from Pastor Jonathan Gaylord

"The shortest distance between two people is a story" (attributed to multiple people).

One of my supervisors as a hospital chaplain intern in seminary once said a useful way to cut through noise and understand our interactions with patients and figure out how to meet the needs of those we served was to ask ourselves two questions:

- 1. Why are they saying/telling this now?
- 2. Why are they telling this to me?

Buried in these two questions is a wealth of information. Are they cursing because they are scared or hurting? Are they swearing at ME because I stand in for God and right now they are angry at God? Are they telling me about a childhood memory out of a desire to return to a simpler time when they were certain of their life? Are they recounting a story of safety because they feel unsafe?



Jesus told stories throughout his ministry with the parables. While we are asking for personal stories, Jesus' use of parables shows us the power of stories. The disciples didn't always understand what was going on in the parables, and the parables excited something in them. The parables drove the people around Jesus to ask questions, go deeper, answer their own questions, and hold their own lives in clear light. Imagine if Jesus had answered the religious leader's question "and who is my neighbor" with "the person you hate the most." Everyone would have gone home and entrenched themselves deeper into what they believed. Instead Jesus gives us the Parable of the Good Samaritan and at the end asks the questioner "which of these men was the man's neighbor?" Everyone went home with a connection they hadn't had before and confronted something in themselves that had previously been unseen.

Stories have that special ability to help us see ourselves and build connection and community. This summer we are going to share our stories. Our prompt is "Tell a story of a time you experienced awe and wonder." We aren't sharing our stories as a competition, there will be no vote or judgement. We are sharing our story as a way to build deeper community. We are sharing stories as a way to invite people into new and different community.

The YMCA Summer camp at YUMC will start on June 12, 2023 and run until August 4, 2023. Pastor Jonathan, met with the camp director Lauryn Scales, Marty Driver, Mildred Carter & Debby Gunnell last week to work on how YUMC can serve as more of a "hands-on" partner this summer. The YMCA is anticipating around 30 elementary aged children through out the summer.

We talked about a focus and schedule to pay off our apportionments by September 30, 2023 to avoid an end of year crunch. This push will begin in earnest after the HVAC capital campaign is completed. 
# **Holiday Bazaar**



#### YMCA COACH'S CREED

- 1. I pledge myself to uphold the mission of the YMCA in my association with team members, coaches, spectators, and opposing teams.
- 2. I will exemplify all the principles of good sportsmanship and instill them in the youth under my care. I will not permit any unsportsmanlike conduct from players or spectators representing the team I am coaching.
- 3. I will, by personal example, display the qualities of leadership, which will inspire youth to strive toward the goal of good leadership and sportsmanship.
- 4. In accordance with the YMCA principles, I shall make fair play and good sportsmanship the primary objective of all competition.
- 5. My primary aim as a YMCA coach shall be the development of youth spiritually, mentally, and physically.
- 6. I will abide by and uphold the rules and regulations governing athletic contests, as established by the YMCA.
- I will, at the conclusion of each game, line up my team facing our opposition and lead them in shaking hands with each member and coach of the opposing team.

#### **VOLUNTEER BEHAVIORAL CODE**

- 1. At no time during a YMCA program may a volunteer be alone with a single child where they cannot be observed by other adults.
- 2. Volunteers shall never leave a child unsupervised.
- 3. Volunteers will not abuse children including:
  - A. Physical Abuse strike, shake, spank, slap
  - B. Verbal Abuse humiliate, degrade, threaten
  - C. Sexual Abuse including inappropriate touching and exposure
  - D. Mental Abuse or Neglect
  - North Carolina state law requires that any suspicion of abuse or neglect must be reported to the Department of Social Services and/or a law enforcement agency.
- 4. Volunteers must use positive techniques of guidance, including positive reinforcement and encouragement rather than competition, comparison and criticism. Volunteers shall abstain from humiliating or frightening discipline techniques. Appropriate disciplinary action must not be associated with food, rest, or extensive separation from group.
- 5. Volunteers must treat all program participants, members, and other volunteers of all races, religions, and cultures with respect and consideration.
- 6. Volunteers will refrain from intimate displays of affection towards others in the presence of program participants, members and other volunteers.
- 7. Using, possessing, or being under the influence of alcohol or illegal drugs will not be tolerated.
- 8. In keeping with promotion of healthy lifestyles, smoking or use of tobacco products on YMCA property and during YMCA activities/events is prohibited.
- 9. Volunteers must be free of health conditions that might adversely affect program participants', members', or other volunteers' health, including fever or contagious conditions.
- 10. Volunteers will portray a positive role model for youth by maintaining respect, loyalty, patience, integrity, courtesy, tact, and maturity.
- 11. Volunteers may not be alone with children that they meet in YMCA programs outside of the YMCA. This includes but is not limited to baby-sitting, sleepovers, and inviting children to their home without the child's parental/guardian's permission.
- 12. Volunteers are discouraged from giving gifts to program participants or members. Volunteers may not accept substantial gifts from program participants or members.
- 13. The YMCA is committed to maintaining an environment that is free from discrimination. Volunteers are covered by the YMCA's anti-harassment policy.





#### APPLICANT'S STATEMENT OF AFFIRMATION

I have read and agree to abide by the **Volunteer Behavioral Code and Coach's Creed.** I understand that if I am in violation of any of the YMCA's codes of conduct, I will be subject to disciplinary action up to and including termination as a YMCA volunteer. In addition, I understand and agree that I may be removed as a volunteer by the YMCA at any time and for any reason in the YMCA's sole discretion.

I hereby affirm that I have accurately completed this volunteer application. My answers to all the questions are true and correct and I have not knowingly withheld any fact or circumstance that may, if disclosed, affect my application unfavorably. I understand that any false or incomplete information submitted in this application may result in my termination as a YMCA volunteer.

I hereby give my permission for the YMCA to utilize the services of an outside agency to obtain a security checks report, including a check of my criminal history, motor vehicle record, and social security number verification as part of the procedure for processing my application for volunteering. I understand that before I am denied the opportunity to volunteer based on information obtained in the report, I will be provided a copy of the report and a description in writing of my rights under the Fair Credit Reporting Act. I understand that if I disagree with the accuracy of any information in this report, I must notify the YMCA within five days of my receipt of the report. If I notify the YMCA within five days of the receipt of the report that I am challenging information in the report, the YMCA will not make a final decision on my volunteer status until after I have had a reasonable opportunity to address the information contained in the report. I understand that my volunteering with the YMCA is conditional based on the results of a criminal record check and MVR Report and that the YMCA has sole discretion in making this decision. Finally I authorize the YMCA to repeat the criminal history and motor vehicle records check at any time.
