# A message from Pastor Jonathan Gaylord

I recently read two books by Blair Braverman. Blair is a dog musher, writer, and adventurer who I first encountered on a few different podcasts I listen to. Often, she is brought on as a guest host to offer perspective on tragedies and survival in nature. Obviously, it was these podcasts that I felt compelled to listen to while I was driving to the Smokies a few weeks ago for a multi-night solo backpacking trip. Blair and the main podcast host regaled me about the mystery of the Dyatlov Pass incident and the crash of flight 571 and the passengers efforts to survive.

In one of the episodes Blair said something that struck me differently on my way into the backcountry. Talking about the dangers of nature Blair said that "nature doesn't hate you, its not out to get you. Nature is indifferent, and I find that fact very comforting." She goes on to say that evil and hatred are human traits, but even in the backcountry you get deep enough into nature and some barrier falls away.

If you run into a random person deep in the woods, you are meeting someone facing the same things you are and you have an instant connection and camaraderie that wouldn't exist back in the air conditioning. I find this to be true while backpacking. You meet people on the trail and at campsites, and nine times out of ten conversation and sharing come easily. Its like the ground shifts and you find a long lost sibling, I mean sometimes they are a bit odd... but who doesn't have a weird relative?

What if church were a place that stood against a world that called us to particular boxes and ways of being, instead proclaiming that we were in this thing called life together? I firmly believe that in Christ and with the Holy Spirit the church can be this place, a place where those barriers we erect are discarded and the people we encounter are greeted with a level of trust, love, curiosity, and holiness. We can stand together, uplifted and empowered by God to love one another and our world.

Our first step is to root ourselves in God's love, to recognize that the barriers that exist in our lives and in the world do not have eternal value. The love of God gives us the power to invite our neighbors into a welcoming and safe place where we can freely share the grace and gifts of God with each other. Root

yourself in God's love, and then show and share that love as widely and wildly as you can.

You are a beloved Child of Christ and I hope that the community of YUMC is a place where you find hope and home. We are in this together, under the love of Jesus Christ.

# A Note from NETworX Igniting Potential & Transformation Together

If NETworX is a "poverty" initiative, why does so much of it revolve around food? We begin each NETworX gathering with dinner for two reasons: it ensures that no one has to miss NETworX because they had to stay home and make dinner for their family, and eating dinner together helps us to relax and break down barriers between people from different walks of life. Food helps us to become family. We potluck on the first Monday of every month as an act of reciprocal love for one another. One thing that Hispanic and Southern cultures have in common is that we will love you deeply through food. Every carefully chosen ingredient and every delicately placed seasoning is an act of love and care, and we share this love and these talents with one another monthly in what feels like a celebration.





Our work in the community garden came about as a way for us to live healthier lives, but it is also an act of food sovereignty and justice, as Mr. Everette passes down his knowledge and our Hispanic community shares culturally appropriate foods (have you ever made tea from Basil to calm your nervous system?) We grow food together with dignity and not as an act of charity. We can food together under the tutelage of one of our participants to reduce waste and increase our knowledge of forgotten foodways. Our Grassroots Kitchen is also a way for us to cook together and increase food security without using a charity model. We cook together, with rather than for. We learn from and teach each other so very much.

While food is a celebration, it can also be a burden, our Grassroots Kitchen programming is an ef-

fort to reduce the personal food burdens of the women in our community, but NETworX has seen a sharp decline in the number of organizations and groups willing to share their resources and time with us by sharing dinner. This increases the funding burden on NETworx to provide dinner. A typical dinner for NETworX costs between \$150-\$200 under current inflation. We usually ask a group to donate once per quarter at most. If your group, or a group you know, would be interested in donating dinner and joining our community as we have dinner; please let me know. We would love to welcome you.
