

our creator, yet we are so afraid to be vulnerable together.



As temperatures around the world continue to be record breaking hot, we here in Hong Kong have not escaped this global heat wave. With temperatures upwards of 33C (91.4F) weekly for more than a month and even hitting above 40C (104F) a few times, we can't say we're too excited as August approaches and is usually the hottest month here. We give thanks for the occasional rain shower that breaks up the heat for a bit. Even with these hot temperatures, the migrant domestic workers continue to gather weekly for community, fellowship, and a break from work. With no other place to gather but outside, you can imagine how hot it can be outside on a Sunday. Yet their energy remains high as they serve their fellow migrant domestic workers selflessly.

Still each Sunday, I'm reminded of the little blessings. With a passing of a cool water or drink, sharing of an umbrella to block the sun, or a gift of a hand held fan to try and disperse the hot air, each week is full of unexpected blessing. The heat slows us down yet in that, we are able to be fully present in the moment. Whether its the conversation walking to the restroom through the air conditioner building or the sharing of a ice cream before it melts down your hand. The past month has been full of reminders that have filled my heart with love and reminders of community despite the heat.

So as we look forward to August, and then the "ber" months which brings a cooling of temperatures and the holidays closer. The "Ber" months of SeptemBER, OctoBER, NovemBER and DecemBER are known in the Filipino communities as Christmas season. Reminders of migrants chosen community and family here in Hong Kong and their loved ones left behind in their home countries.

As I look forward to cooling temperatures but also for the unexpected blessings I'll discover in August. i give thanks for my chosen community and family back in the United States who continue to support me with prayers, messages and donations to my advance.
