A message from Pastor Jonathan Gaylord

I just finished a training to guide my pastoral practice around premarital/couples counseling. In the very last video, the trainer John Gottman, \was answering a question about modern online dating and trying to find a "compatible partner" as the first part of the relationship. As part of his answer he said "A relationship is what you create together." He went on to say that relationships are a "temporal structure based on a pattern of interaction." This really struck and has stuck with me.



I first thought that this was excellent advice for couples in a romantic relationship, relationships take consistent and ongoing effort on the part of both people. My second thought was "what a good description of discipleship, faith, and being part of a church community."

Our relationship with God (discipleship) is grounded in time spent with God and asks for our commitment to grow spiritually. As we have said before, discipleship is something we do on purpose. We cannot accidentally stumble our way into discipleship.

Our relationship with the church is similar. Through our membership vows we all commit to being a particular kind of community in a particular place. We are not a social club or an affinity group. In the UMC our vows say that we will support the church through our "prayers, presence, gifts, service, and witness." Church isn't something that happens accidentally, we commit to being here in this place, serving God together. From the movement of the Holy Spirit, to the saints who came before us, to the ways we impact the community and spread the Gospel today, nothing about the Church is an accident! We want to build this community and spread God's love on purpose. Our relationships with God and with one another are what we create together.

The Leadership Team is making it their priority to make sure everyone has a place to be connected to the mission and ministry of Yadkinville UMC. We want to ensure that everyone in our community has a stake in the making of disciples here in this place.

If you are passionate about something in our community or if you know that you have a gift for a specific purpose, reach out to a member of the Leadership Team or Lay Leadership & Nominations Committee and let them know. If you don't know what your gifts are or are unsure about how you can plug in, simply reach out and let them know that you are ready to serve. We want to find a place for you to spread the good news of Jesus Christ!

None of this happens on accident! We are part of this ministry together!

Hello Church Family,

The Leadership Team met on Tuesday, August 22nd, 2023, for their scheduled monthly meeting. The team came together in 2021 as part of the transition to a Simplified Accountable Structure (SAS). Over the last two years, the Leadership Team has redefined the administration of the church, combining four committees into one, meeting monthly to address the needs of the church. The SAS structure centralized committees and meetings, allowing congregation mem-



bers more time to carry out missions. Most of the administrative work of the church has been addressed. The Church has worked through several big challenges recently: the open and collaborative creation of our Belief Statement, desperately needed HVAC replacement, and separate lighting upgrades in our family life center and our Sanctuary.

The team will shift its focus from church administration to our church's mission to create and develop disciples for Christ. Our goal will be congregation engagement in all the exciting ways our members can contribute within the church and in the community. Music Ministry, Building and Grounds, Men's Group, Kitchen Committee, Parsonage Committee, United Women in Faith, School's Out IE Days, Card Ministry, etc. are just some of the groups our members can connect with to take part in moving the discipleship mission forward.

Looking toward this fall, our church is coming into a busy season filled with activities and ways our congregation can be involved in the life of the church. Mission Focus for September

AGAPE (American Greater Armenian Partnership Efforts)

Project AGAPE, a ministry to Armenia, is a collaborative effort of the North Carolina and the Western North Carolina Conferences of The United Methodist Church in a joint effort with the Armenian Apostolic Church.

From the day of its foundation until now, AGAPE has adopted and committed to the following goals:

- Share the love and hope of Christ with the people of Armenia
- Contribute to the Christian education of the Armenian people
- Develop humanitarian and benevolent activities

During 30 years of activities, AGAPE has led different projects, served people in Kashatagh and in border villages, now serve the displaced people who had to leave due to the war in 2020.

It is with deep regret that the Agape Board announced that **there will be NO 2023 Fall collection of Christmas Boxes** this year. The reasons for this decision are as follows:

Project AGAPE lost its warehouse in Yerevan in July because the owners, the Armenian military, needed to use it for other purposes. Nara Melkonyan, Project AGAPE in Country Director, is currently looking for a replacement warehouse.

The shipping industry is still experiencing delays that started during the Pandemic. The Board has only been able to send one shipment from the Mission Response Center to Armenia in 2023. Because the wonderful donations in 2021 and 2022 the WNCC warehouse in Terrell is full to the brim. It currently has 3.5 to 4 sea container loads of donations ready to send.

So, until the Board can rent another warehouse in Yerevan and successfully ship the present supply of donations, it must suspend all further collections.

But, we can still help with the Christmas Box project!

A group of volunteers go to the Mission Response Center each month to inspect the Christmas Boxes. They need help with some supplies for the boxes that lack essentials like socks, underwear, caps, etc. Some items needed are on tags on a tree in the Commons. Please take a tag, purchase the item, and place in the plastic tub by September 17, 2023. 
