Our Financial Health: I would like to express my appreciation to all members and friends of YUMC for your diligent and generous giving in support of our Church and our missions during this difficult time. We have been blessed by the regular and continuing support.

At the current time our bank balances are sufficient and assuming continued support will enable us to meet all regular expenses and ministry needs. A part of this is that we did request and receive from the Small Business Administration a Paycheck Protection Program (PPP) loan in the amount of \$25,425.00. When SBA sets up forms and procedures to ask for loan forgiveness we will be making our request and feel that most, if not all, of the loan could be forgiven.

The United Methodist Foundation reduced the loan interest rate on all loans including our building loan and that has been very helpful. The Conference has also helped with some reduced and deferred expense payments for all churches. The Finance Committee will be reviewing all Budget items in October to project if all requests for expenses and apportionments can be achieved.


