## Members of Interfaith Action of Evanston serve nearly 36,500 meals a year.

You may not realize it, but this soup kitchen you're working at today, and ones just like it elsewhere in Evanston, operate every day of the week, every week of the year. That's right, every day of every week of every month all year long, there's a soup kitchen in Evanston for any of our neighbors who are hungry.

And all of these soup kitchens are run by members of an organization you might not have heard of - [Interfaith Action of Evanston](#). Collectively we've been doing this for decades, since 1979 in fact. That's over 30 years - a long time. When you figure that we now serve around 100 people every day that adds up to a lot of mouths to feed - about 36,500 every year in fact.

So, for your part in this great effort we are extremely thankful. Whether this is your first time serving, whether you come several times a year or several times a month, it's important to know that you're part of something much bigger than yourself. By being here even once you DO make a difference in the lives of the people you serve and the people you serve with. ## We also run a Hospitality Center for the Homeless

You might also be interested in knowing that [Interfaith Action of Evanston's](#) service to our hungry and homeless neighbors doesn't end with our soup kitchens. In addition we run the Hospitality Center for the Homeless, located at St. Mark's Episcopal Church, five mornings a week, every week of the year. There we provide a light breakfast, a warm place to rest, job counseling services, voice mailboxes, computer training and much more.

### ... and Winter Warming Centers

And that's not all. Five days a week in the winter, from November through March, we provide afternoon warming centers where anyone who wants to get out of the cold can - no questions asked. There they find companionship, a safe place to nap, a light snack, sometimes movies, sometimes games, but mostly a welcoming place to escape the bone chilling cold.



### ... and an Emergency Overnight Shelter

And we're still not done. During the coldest of months, on the coldest of nights, when the temperatures drop to 5° or below, we operate an overnight emergency shelter in cooperation with Connections for the Homeless so no one has to risk his or her life outside during the coldest of nights.



## And... We Talk Together

Throughout the year [Interfaith Action of Evanston](#) also sponsors various opportunities for inter-religious relationship building. We eat, sing, study, give thanks, create, walk, and talk together about those things we hold dear and the values of service which unite us.
