Does membership mean I am a Christian?

No. There is only one way to becoming a Christian and that is turning from your sin, and trusting in Jesus for the forgiveness of your sins. Church membership is meant to be a church's corporate affirmation of your profession of faith in Christ.

What is the Church?

The Church exists for the display of the Glory of God because all things exist for His Glory. For believers this means we know that there is something much bigger than ourselves. Through God's grace we have been invited into His redemptive purposes in the world.

Just as the human body relies upon mutual dependence of individual members for proper functioning, so the Body of Christ, the Church, requires sacrificial and responsible service by its individual members. Scripture says, "The eye cannot say to the hand, 'I have no need of you,' nor again, the head to the feet, 'I have need of you' " (1 Corinthians 12:21). Likewise, a member of the Church cannot say to another member that he or she is unnecessary. We all have gifts that differ according to the gracious provision of the Holy Spirit (Roman 2:3-8). Contrary to the beliefs of our culture, we need each other.

Is Church Membership Biblical?

Every Christian should join a church because Scripture requires it. Granted, there is no direct command in Scripture that says, "Every Christian must join a local church," but there are two factors in Scripture that indicate that every Christian should be a member of a local Church.

- Jesus established the Church to be a public, earthly institution that would mark out, affirm and oversee those who profess to believe in Him. Jesus established the Church to publicly declare those who belong to Him in order to give the world a display of the Good News about Himself. Jesus wants the world to know who belongs to Him and who does not. And how is the world to know who belongs and who does not? The world is to see which people publicly identify with His people in the visible, public institution He established for His purpose. They are to look at the members of His Church. And if some people claim to be part of the universal church even though they belong to no local church, they are rejecting Jesus' plan for them and His Church. Jesus intends for His people to be marked out as a visible, public group, which means joining together in local churches.
- Scripture repeatedly commands Christians to submit to their leaders. The only way to accomplish this is by publicly committing to be members of their flock and saying, in effect, "I commit to listening to your teaching, following your direction, and to submitting to your leadership." There is no way to obey the scriptural commands, to submit to your leaders, if you never actually submit by joining a local church.

Why Should I Join a Church?

To Assure

While a person should not feel he needs to join a church in order to be saved, belonging to a church is a step to being a healthy Christian. Christians, those who are indwelt by the Holy Spirit, will naturally gravitate toward other Christians and will desire to be with them, to learn from them, and to serve them. A person who professes Christ but feels no desire to be among his believing brothers and sisters is not a healthy Christian.

To Evangelize

The gospel is best spread through collaborative efforts. Throughout the history of the church, people have attempted great things on their own and can been successful. But more often, great things have been accomplished through the collaborate efforts of Christians working together in Christ. If we are to reach this world with the gospel message of Jesus Christ, we must work together.

To Expose

As we labor, fellowship, and serve alongside other Christians, and as we observe the lives of other Christ-followers, we will see what biblical Christianity looks like. The more we see and experience genuine Christianity, the more the counterfeits will be exposed. As members of the local church, we support and submit to the teaching and work together to recognize truth and to expose corruptions and imitations of the true gospel.

To Edify

Joining a church will help Christians counter their sinful individualism and teach them the importance of seeking to serve and encourage others. The benefit of being a member of a local church is not primarily inward, but outward. Christians attend a local church so they might have opportunities to serve others and thus to serve God. Every Christian should be eager to serve within the church and to edify others through teaching, serving and exercising their spiritual gifts.

To Glorify

We can bring glory to God through the way we live our lives. God is honored when we are obedient to Him. He is glorified when His people come together in unity and harmony to find assurance, to evangelize the world, to expose false gospels, and to edify one another. God is glorified in and through the local church.

Requirements for Membership at HTC

A Personal Profession of Faith Romans 10:9-13

Each person should be prepared to share their testimony. One testimony may not be as dramatic as another, but all Christians have a personal testimony. Besides your salvation experience, your testimony may include what God has done for you since you accepted Jesus Christ as your Savior.

Believer's Baptism Matthew 28:19-20
Baptism is the immersion of a believer in water.

It is an act of obedience symbolizing the believer's faith in a crucified, buried, and risen Savior. In addition it symbolizes the believer's death to sin, the burial of the old life and the resurrection to walk in newness of life in Christ Jesus.
