CALL TO CONFESSION

Family of faith, on the night of Jesus' birth, a crowd of angels appeared before a group of rag-tag shepherds to tell them the good news.

The angels could have gone to Herod's house. The angels could have sung in the city square. The angels could have found the most important, faithful, and powerful to share the good news, but instead they told a group of low-status shepherds. The angels' message was clear: this is good news of great joy for all people. The good news of this night is for you too—no matter who you are, what you've done or left undone. The angels are singing for you. So join me in the Prayer of Confession. Join me in drawing closer to the God who has already drawn close to us. Let us pray.

PRAYER OF CONFESSION

God of angel choruses, you hang the stars in the sky, but we do not see them.

You fill the night with angelic song, but we do not hear it.

You send shepherds to tell the good news, but we do not believe them.

You bring love into the world, but we do not seek it.

Quiet the fear in us that works to rationalize, minimize, and distract from the good news you put forth into the world.

Tune our hearts back to your song.

With hope we pray, amen.

WORDS OF FORGIVENSS

Family of faith, when the angels arrived in the field that night, the shepherds were afraid. But the angels said:

"Do not be afraid.

I am bringing you good news of great joy for all people."

SCRIPTURE READING: Luke 1:26-35

An angel Gabriel was sent by God to a town in Galilee called Nazareth, ²⁷ to a virgin engaged to a man whose name was Joseph, of the house of David. The virgin's name was Mary. ²⁸ And he came to her and said, "Greetings, favored one! The Lord is with you." ²⁹ But she was much perplexed by his words and pondered what sort of greeting this might be. ³⁰ The angel said to her, "Do not be afraid, Mary, for you have found favor with God. ³¹ And now, you will conceive in your womb and bear a son, and you will name him Jesus. ³² He will be great and will be called the Son of the Most High, and the Lord God will give to him the throne of his ancestor David. ³³ He will reign over the house of Jacob forever, and of his kingdom there will be no end." ³⁴ Mary said to the angel, "How can this be, since I am a virgin?" ³⁵ The angel said to her, "The Holy Spirit will come upon you, and the power of the Most High will overshadow you; therefore the child to be born will be holy; he will be called Son of God.
