- **Read Scripture:** As we consider the pathway of service, take a look at these two important passages about Jesus' heart to serve.
 - **Philippians 2:5-11** In your relationships with one another, have the same mindset as Christ Jesus: Who, being in very nature[a] God, did not consider equality with God something to be used to his own advantage; rather, he made himself nothing by taking the very nature[b] of a servant, being made in human likeness. And being found in appearance as a man, he humbled himself by becoming obedient to death — even death on a cross. Therefore God exalted him to the highest place and gave him the name that is above every name, that at the name of Jesus every knee should bow, in heaven and on earth and under the earth, and every tongue acknowledge that Jesus Christ is Lord, to the glory of God the Father. Philippians 2:5-11

Avenue 1/ Week 1

Serving at Home

WEEK 1: will focus on serving at home, serving your spouse, children, siblings, parents or roommates. Do your usual and then add one more; cleaning toilets, vacuuming, dishes, taking the trash out or doing laundry, for example. You can still serve these people even if they no longer live with you.

Day 1: Read Galatians 5:13

Almighty God, I thank you for the freedom you have given me, help me to use that freedom to serve others humbly in love. Amen

Day 2: Read Matthew 20:28

Jesus, you came to give your life for me and to serve, help me to follow your example with those close to me.

Day 3: Read Colossians 3:23,24

Lord Jesus, as I serve, let me remember that I am serving you and to do it with all of my heart. Amen

Day 4: Read Philippians 2:3,4

God, you want me to value others and with humility to see their interests; give me that mind set today.

Day 5: Read 1 John 3:18

Dear Father, give me the actions to serve others, not just words.

Day 6: Read Romans 12:1

God, as part of my worship you want me to use my body as a living sacrifice, help me to understand what that means today.

Avenue 2/ Week 2

Avenue 3/ Week 3

Serving in Your Neighborhood/ Circle

Is Jesus calling you to improve your serve? This may not mean doing more things (although it could), it may mean improving your attitude around serving to be more Christ-like. The focus this week is on neighbors, co-workers, friends or acquaintances. Some of these may actually ask for your help, others hope you see their need.

God, give us hospitable hearts, and serve others with your strength so that you get praise and glory.

Day 17: Read 1 Corinthians 9:19-23

God, help me to serve others, being sensitive to who they are.

Day 18: Read Galatians 5:14

Loving Heavenly Father, remind me to love my neighbor, co-worker, friends and acquaintances; and to see their need.

Day 19: Read Hebrews 6:10,11

God, give me your diligence as I love those whom you love.

Day 20: Read Ephesians 6:7,8

Lord, give me wholeheartedness in my serving as that is what you want.

Avenue 4/ Week 4
