# I'M THINKING... BURN BRIGHTLY

The first strand of lights was invented by none other than Thomas Edison. During the Christmas of 1880, Mr. Edison hung a strand of lightbulbs outside of his laboratory in Menlo Park, New Jersey. These lights could be seen while traveling through the area by train and were also used to light the path from the train to the lab. Two years later Edison's friend and colleague, Mr. Edward Johnson, wound 80 hand-wired red, white, and blue lights around his Christmas tree and the rest is history. For over a century people have been putting strands of lights on buildings and on trees in celebration of the Christmas season.

While Christmas lights have been the source of great joy down through the years, they have also been a source of incredible stress and frustration. There are few things that can put a wet blanket on holiday fun faster than having a light go out on a strand of lights after they've already been placed on the tree. Often, one light going out causes several to go out. It is exceedingly difficult, if not impossible, to find and replace the burned-out bulb. Even making the attempt can cause other bulbs to go out and leave you worse off than when you started.

In the Myers house, we've learned to accept the reality that bulbs go out from time to time and we choose to enjoy the bulbs that remain. If you were to come look at the tree in our house closely, you would notice that about one out of every four lights on a portion of one strand of lights is out. The strand of lights is still beautiful and brings us joy, but it doesn't shine quite as brightly.

Every Christmas I'm reminded that for all of the celebration and joy, there is always a bit of sadness. For some of us the Christmas season reminds us of loved ones who are no longer with us. For others, we are reminded of fractured relationships. There are a number of issues that represent burned-out bulbs on the trees of our lives. While we can see and experience the beauty of Christmas through the bulbs that burn brightly, there are those bulbs that no longer burn, and that brings a tinge of sadness. But let us not forget to WHOM the lights point. Though bulbs may go dark from time to time and sorrow may pierce our hearts, we still have reason for joy. The baby born in a stable has borne our sorrows. He is the source of our joy. He is the light of our lives. He is God with us, and He will never leave us nor forsake us.

During this season of joy let us pray for those who are experiencing sadness. May we remember our connection through Jesus Christ and may we draw close to one another in love. May the joy of Christ flow freely through us and cause us to burn brightly for those who feel as though the light has burned out.
