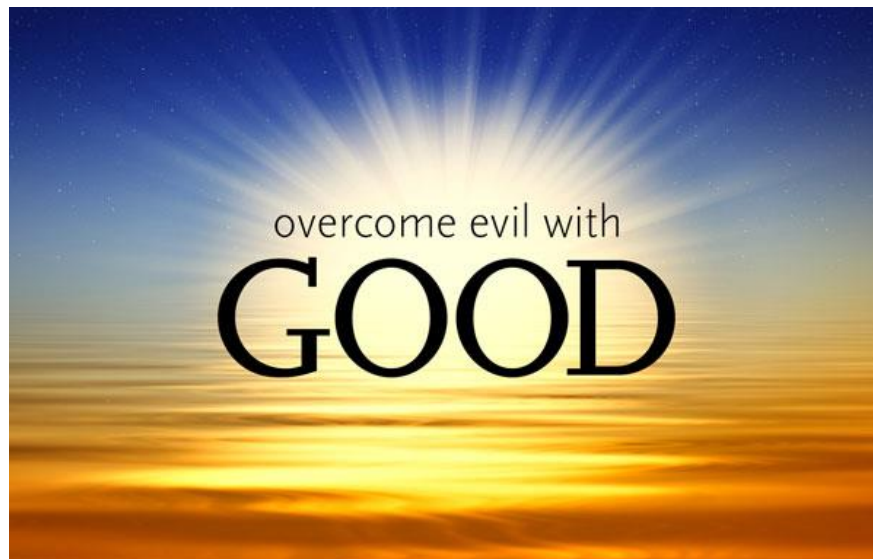

In the certain hope that nothing can separate us from your love, we offer these prayers to you; through Jesus Christ our Lord. **Amen.**

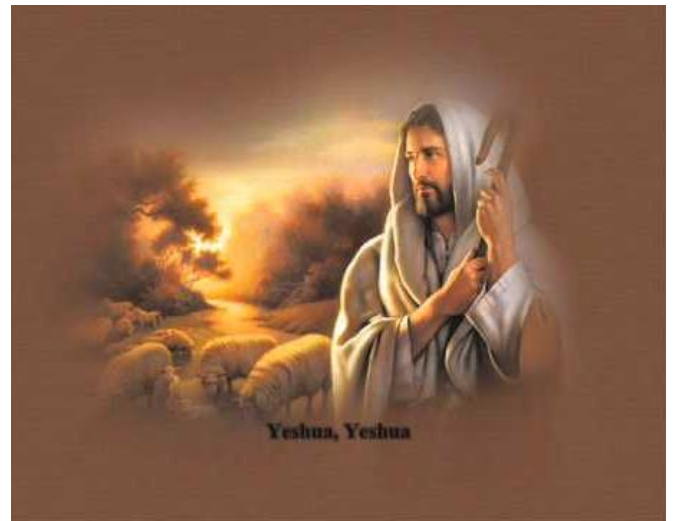

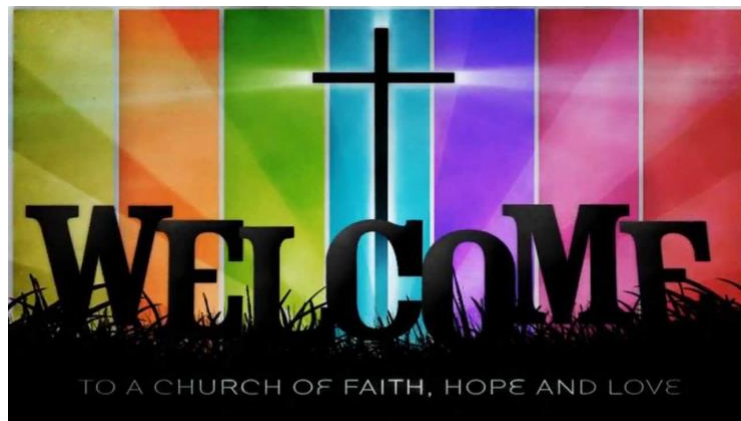

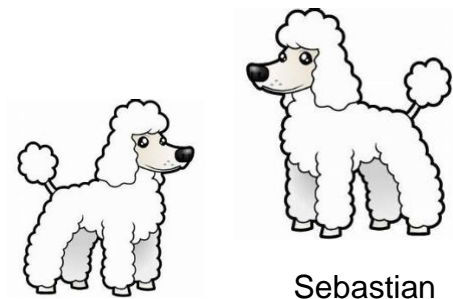
All social distancing and mask rules will be in effect.
