My friends, I am very excited that next Thursday, LPPC will be hosting a potluck for two pastors who are coming to us from the nation of Cuba, Ary and Beidy. Our Presbytery has an important partnership with the island of Cuba, and I am proud that we can provide the space to celebrate that partnership. But I am also excited about this event for reasons you may not expect.

More than twenty years ago, when I was a student at Columbia Seminary in Decatur, Georgia, I developed a friendship with a student named Hunter Camp. We shared many laughs together and enjoyed each other's company, but we lost touch after Seminary. Some years ago, I reconnected with Hunter on social media, when I learned that he's serving a church in Florida. Then, just last night, I was looking on social media, when I saw that Ary and Beidy just visited Hunter's church in Florida!

I share this story with you, because I believe these kinds of connections are what our life together in the church is all about. I am filled with joy to welcome Ary and Beidy to LPPC, because we have a valuable partnership with the church in Cuba. But because we have a mutual connection with Hunter, Ary and Beidy already have a special place in my heart, even though I haven't even met them yet.
