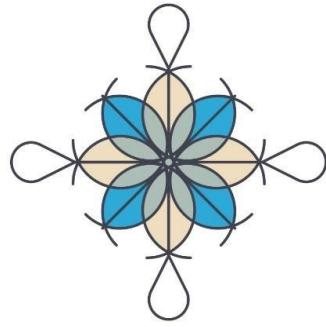

Pastor's Report, 2024 Review – Pastor TJ Turner

The real transition that WCC experienced was a transition in our vision and identity as a church.

Believe – To believe God is doing a new thing at WCC, empowering us, as we are, to bring refuge to the disconnected people around us.

- Prayer emphasis, small groups, Kids Hope, Sharing life and youth ministries.
- NCD Assessment results were very encouraging as it found that the overall spiritual health of WCC had grown in every area, across the board.

Connect - Connect with the hurting and disconnected people around us through practical ministry and compassionate care.

- Small groups expanded, new leaders stepped up. Continued Welcome Lunches, Sharing Life, VBS, Trunk or Treat and Grief Share.

Focus – Focus our efforts on the things God has led us to.

- Some ministries ended, others expanded and some were new.

Pastor's Annual Report

2025: Reaching out

Pastor TJ Turner

Now to him who is able to do immeasurably more than all we ask or imagine, according to his power that is at work within us, to him be glory in the church and in Christ Jesus throughout all generations, for ever and ever!

Ephesians 3:20-21

The last year and a half have really marked a new phase in the life of WCC. After a several year process of developing a new vision and seeking direction from God, the last 18 months have been all about taking the next step and following where God has led us, the next step in living out the vision we developed together.

That vision begins with Connecting to People. So, for the past year and a half, our primary focus has been on connecting, and living out the belief that **God is calling us to reach out to the disconnected, struggling people around us and bring them in.** For 2025, we worked to do that in three primary ways.

Equip

First, we understood the process of reaching out has to begin here. After all, stepping into the work of God in our lives requires faith and courage. So, our first goal for 2025 was: *To equip everyone at WCC for the ministry God is calling us to both in the church and in the rest of our lives.* Throughout the year, we worked to do that in a number of different ways

- **Ministry Huddles** – One of the first steps we took was to develop Ministry Huddles. These were training events developed for each distinct ministry at WCC, intended to help everyone involved step out and trust God to work through them. Through the year, we held huddles for our Welcome Team, Worship Team, Sound and Video Team, Kids Hope, and for our Kids Ministry Teams, working to help equip each ministry to serve the Lord and WCC with faith and assurance that he will work through us.
- **Training Seminars** – We also took part in two larger training seminars in 2025. First, we hosted a Safeguarding Seminar for our leaders and for everyone involved in Kids Ministry at WCC. Pete Singer led us through an eye-opening and incredibly helpful process of learning how to protect our kids and to be more aware of abuse and recognize the ways we can be the hands and feet of Jesus in the lives of hurting families. We're profoundly grateful to

Pete for his willingness to lead us through one of his last trainings, and to and to Chris, Emily, Cassie, and Andrew for graciously sharing him with us at that time.

Second, our CCCC Regional Pastor, Ray DeLaurier, led us through a seminar on Biblical Peacemaking. This was an amazing event, helping us learn how to both heal and prevent conflict in the church in ways that honor God and grow our faith.

- **Leadership Training** – in addition, we held leadership training events throughout the year to better equip all of our ministry leaders to help us grow in our faith as we follow Jesus. We also continued to work with the CCCC Director of Church Development, John Kimball, on our denomination's church development process to help ensure WCC is a healthy, Gospel-centered church.
- **Small Groups** – of course, one of the most important ways we worked to equip everyone was through our small groups as we came together to study the word of God, to grow our faith, and to recognize the places he is calling us to reach out with the good news of his love.

Connect

Once we began working to connect, the next goal was: *To connect with the hurting and disconnected people around us through practical ministry and compassionate care.* We worked to do this in three primary ways.

- **Connection-focused Ministries** – First, we continued to develop several ministries that help connect very directly to the people around us. This includes Kids Hope - through which 7 church members were able to mentor kids at Middleton Elementary and Lake Middle School, and GreifShare, where we have had the opportunity to minister to dozens of grieving people, sharing the hope of Christ with them.
- **Outreach Events** – Second, we held several outreach events through the year that were intended to help us connect. This included an Egg Hunt at Easter, our Trunk or Treat in October where an estimated 400+ kids stopped by, VBS in the summer that enabled us to invite in kids from the community around us, and a food drive during the Christmas Season.
- **Individual Outreach** – finally, but most importantly, we worked to encourage everyone at WCC to recognize the opportunities we all have to reach out. After all, the mission of God isn't just for us as a church, it's for each of us as God's Ambassadors called to the ministry of Reconciliation.

Bring People In

That leads to our last goal for 2025, which was to *bring new people in to connect and build relationships at WCC*. We worked to do that in a few primary ways.

- **Welcome Lunches** – Our Welcome Lunches continued to be an important way people connect and begin to build relationships.
- **Fellowship Meals** – Over the summer, we transitioned to fellowship meals. These were smaller, more focused opportunities for people to build relationships beyond the surface, to make real connections and find the kind of supporting relationships the church of Jesus was designed to be about from the beginning.
- **Small Groups** – and again, this ultimately led to small groups, where people were invited to come in, build relationships, pray for and support each other, and grow together in the word of God. Through 2025, we saw small groups grow and change, with new people taking part and new relationships forming as we followed Christ together.

In all of these things, *God has done more than we asked or imagined*. After all, in 2025, we have seen people come to faith in Jesus and be baptized. We've seen new families come in and find the support they need. We've seen struggling families find food to make it through and support in their hardship. We've seen grieving people find hope and isolated people find real connection. We've seen our church grow, not because we have the most amazing pastor or the most dynamic worship (as great as our worship is!), but because we have been the church of Jesus, a place people come together, where all the divisions the world creates are overcome by the power of Jesus, where we have connected to Jesus and each other as he works to build a kingdom of peace and goodness and grace.

So join us for what comes next as we follow Christ together.

Children's Ministries Report

Volunteers

In 2025, the Children's ministry team started with 6 volunteers: Stephanie Ashrafi, Terri Beran, Jill Boltin, Val Ashrafi, Elise Brossard (Youth), and Eden Moua. As the year progressed, the team grew by 3. They are: Paula Beason, Brenda Minette, and Willem Obermoller (Youth).

Attendance

Our average weekly attendance for 2025 is 5 kids in one Sunday. This was the same as last year. Graduates this year were 3 students who moved on to Youth. Lastly, at most we had 7 students in one Sunday, and at the least we 0 kids a few times this year.

VBS

Our biggest event during this season was Vacation Bible School (VBS). This year's theme was "Live It Out", with each day focusing on a different way to live like Jesus: loving one another, forgiving one another, and serving one another. Children learned Bible stories, memorized verses, and participated in activities that brought these lessons to life. The program ran for three days and was made possible by the dedication of 26 volunteers—both those serving directly with the kids and those assisting behind the scenes. We had between 13–17 children attend each day, ranging from ages 3 to 12. While our original goal was to reach 30-40 kids, this experience provided valuable insight for planning next year. We intend to be more intentional with our outreach and will consider which age groups, times of day, and days of the week best serve the families we want to reach.

A highlight of our curriculum was the opportunity to give and serve. We partnered with Soles4Souls, and together we collected 207 pairs of shoes and \$12 in monetary donations.

Another new element we introduced this year was transportation, providing pick-up and drop-off for children without a way to get to VBS. This helped make our program accessible to more families within our community.

Curriculum

The curriculum used to teach the children this year was the Gospel Project. There were also lessons in biblical vocabulary words, The Lord's Prayer, and memorized scriptures. Some of the memorized scriptures are Proverbs 3:5, James 1:17, and Psalm 136.

Nursery Ministry Report

One of the exciting new developments in 2025 was the development of a regular Nursery Ministry for younger kids. Starting at the end of 2024, Cassie Molina led our nursery ministry. Throughout the year, the number of kids varied, with up to 9 kids under 3 years old playing together in the nursery, enabling their families to worship, knowing their kids are being well taken care of.

Thanks so much to Cassie and our nursery volunteers, Liz Nygren, Clarice Nelson, Karalee Kem, and Christine Ruud for serving our kids!

Youth Ministry Report

The 2025/26 youth group started with a change of leaders. Bill Aamodt volunteered to help lead the youth group for the year with Angie Brossard. Three gatherings were held in the fall of 2025.

There are nine "regular" students participating. In addition, there have been a number of friends of the students joining us. We started the "Christianity Explored" course and will continue it throughout the school year. We also did a volunteer activity in December: Feed My Starving Children.

Kids Hope Ministry Report

Mission and Vision

Our Kids Hope ministry creates one-on-one mentoring relationships between our church volunteers and students, meeting with one student for one hour each week during the school day, fostering stability and encouragement to children who can benefit from a caring adult in their life.



Volunteers

This calendar year we completed our first full school year of mentoring at Middleton Elementary (September 2024 thru May 2025), ending the year with 7 mentors and 7 prayer partners. This September, we started our second school year, and were able to extend our mentorship to Lake Middle School, following our first student who graduated from Elementary and moved to Middle School. We currently have 6 mentors at Middleton and 1 mentor at Lake.

We've continued to support our 7 mentors who continued this school year, and have gained two new Prayer Partners this year replacing two volunteers from last school year. We also transitioned leadership roles this year as both co-directors moved on from their roles.

Special Events

The WCC family supported our ministry in the following special events:

- During Mentoring Month in January we showed our appreciation and gratitude to the mentors who give their time and support to students each week.
- During Teacher Appreciation Month in May, we provided a snacks to the teachers at Middleton Elementary along with a card signed by our volunteers thanking the teachers for the work they do each day
- During August, we supported a Kids Hope Supply Box drive, buying new supplies and games for our volunteers to use during their mentoring hours.
- We invited each student and their family to our Trunk or Treat event and our Christmas Party and Christmas Eve services.

Conclusion

As our mentors began their second year of mentoring the students, we have seen week by week the relationships between mentors and students continue to deepen and strengthen and our relationships with each school grow and expand.

We are grateful to our mentors, who show up each week and allow their students to feel loved and seen. We appreciate our prayer partners who support our mentors in the hard times and rejoice in the good times. Prayer is the backbone of this ministry and this role is often unnoticed but critical to all we do. We are deeply grateful to Stephanie Ashrafi and Terri Beran who stood up this program and grew it to over 15 volunteers working to support two schools. We thank God for their ministry and the work they've done to ensure our work with Kids Hope will continue.

Last, we ask the WCC family to pray for the students to whom we mentor. Pray that each child will see and feel God's love through their mentor and experience a sense of how special that child is to God.

They also continue to work remotely with the Bible translation team in Tanzania, and was able to be present in Tanzania for the celebration of the distribution of the new Zinza New Testament – praise God! They now live in Arkansas and love being closer to their family. Tim & Chris both had surgery procedures this year but have recovered well. Their finances were stretched significantly with surgeries and the trip to Africa. Pray for their increased financial needs and good health.

Wessmans faced a major change by leaving South Africa and relocating to South Carolina. Stephanie is still functioning as an OM trainer and leader with the challenge of the development and implementation of a new Catalytic Ministries program and a Coach Mentoring Essentials program within OM. JJ has stepped away from the missionary status and accepted a teaching position in a local High School. They incurred major expenses from the move and have found the cost of living double that of Africa. Pray for increased funds and success in their new positions.

Coopers are still working remotely in Thailand through Wycliff with their teams in SE Asia. Current Visas are allowing them to stay in SE Asia to continue their translation work of the Bible, hymns, and oral stories (eight different languages) online with their teams. Their teams still live in areas of political upheaval with an increase in war and violence this past year. Communication with the teams is often difficult, and Beau is involved in much of the computer and technical support. Lisa has been quite ill for much of the year. Pray for the safety of their local teams, and pray for improving strength and health for Lisa.

Brimmers continue working at Camp JIM with evolving roles as needed. The Camp is facing staff shortages and Bill & Lindsey work non-stop and do not hesitate to pick up the slack where needed. They try to concentrate on building each other up and handing out praise to other workers. They have ongoing medical issues, and Lindsey's health has taken a toll on their finances this year. Pray for improved morale at Camp JIM, pray for improved health for their family, and pray for increased financial support.

Mission Budget: The mission budget amount and disbursement is recommended by the Mission Team and approved by the Elders. The proposed budget remains includes a small increase due to increased giving. The increase has been added primarily to the support for the Brimmer family.

2026 Ministry Plans

Growing Together in Christ

Pastor TJ Turner

Every day they continued to meet together in the temple courts. They broke bread in their homes and ate together with glad and sincere hearts, praising God and enjoying the favor of all the people. And the Lord added to their number daily those who were being saved.

Acts 2:46-47

It's been amazing to see some of the ways God has worked over the past few years as we've really focused on Connecting to People. Of course, that is part of the ongoing work of the Church of Jesus, so we're excited to see the ways that Jesus adds more people to our number as they find salvation in Him. At the same time, we believe this is the right time to shift our focus to the second aspect of our Vision: **Growing Together in Christ**.

While 2025 brought many victories and reasons to celebrate the work of Jesus, it also came with some lessons, moments that helped us to see ways we still need to grow as a church. Over the past few years we've grown dramatically in welcoming people into the church, dramatically in finding ways to reach out with the love of Christ. Now, we're shifting our focus to the next step of bringing people in, of helping us take the next step from hospitality to relationship, making sure that everyone at WCC finds kind of support we all need as we live out our faith in the real world.

And so, for 2026, we believe **God is calling us to build a community where people are cared for, and to pursue real growth and change together, through the work of Jesus among us.**

To accomplish that, we're going to work towards three very simple goals.

Bring People In

The first goal is to keep working to bring people in. In 2026 we'll continue to work through ministries like GriefShare and Kids Hope, along with working to add DivorceCare to help connect to people around us and meet their needs. We'll also continue hosting our Welcome Lunches through the year as a great first step to help people build relationships. However, there are a few new ways we'll work to connect and especially to bring people in.

- **Outreach Events** – We'll continue to host outreach events in 2026, but we'll work to learn from past events and adjust to the needs we see now. This may mean adjusting some events, like moving from a Trunk or Treat to a Back to School Block Party, leaning into the needs we've seen with things like additional food drives, or planning new events as God leads us.
- **Intro To WCC** – We'll also work to develop a second step to help people get connected beyond Sunday morning. This has been an ongoing process as to find the right format for this, but in 2026 this will be a priority to make the process of getting involved at WCC simple and accessible.
- **Individual Outreach** – of course, we'll also continue working to encourage and equip you to reach out to the people God has put in your life, to join the work he has for you.

Grow Together

Our second goal for the year is to grow together specifically in our relationships and support for each other. The Bible calls us to bear one another's burdens; it shows us this is how the church works at its best. The challenge is that our culture and the world are hard at work to discourage that kind of connection. So we'll grow together in a few important ways.

- **Ministry Huddles** – We'll plan ministry huddles through the year again, but this year we'll focus on the idea that we are here to serve God *together*, to partner in His work, fostering relationships in our ministries and helping us thrive as we serve the Lord.
- **Fellowship Events** – We'll plan a number of fellowship events throughout the year. This will include another Women's Get Together as well as a Men's Retreat., along with fellowship lunches and other simple opportunities to build relationships.

Church Care Team – The real new development in this area, however, is the Church Care Team. The difficult lesson we learned in 2025 is that it can be surprisingly easy for people to slip through the cracks, with people who need real care and support simply being overlooked in all the busyness of life. So we're developing a new ministry team we're calling the Church Care Team. This team's (tentative) mission is:

- ***To make the connection between welcome and caring support, ensuring everyone at WCC receives the spiritual and relational support they need, especially in times of difficulty.***

In other words, they'll work to make sure everyone at WCC receives the support they need when they need it. Of course, doing that depends on all of us. This team's role won't be to do all the caring for people. Their role is to facilitate, to make sure nobody is overlooked as we grow together.

Grow in Christ

Finally, as we grow together, we'll work to grow in Christ, to grow in our faith, becoming more like Jesus in all of life.

- **Discipleship Focus** – The biggest way we'll do this is by focusing on discipleship and expanding the ways we do that. We will continue working to grow small groups and make sure there's a place for you there, but we'll also work to add new and different types of groups. A Women's Bible study began this past fall that was a huge encouragement. A Men's Discipleship Group is about to begin. We'll continue to support and grow groups like this, and we'll encourage more individual discipleship and mentoring, so that, no matter what the right fit is for you, we can all grow in our faith in Christ together.
- **Prayer Focus** – We'll also work to increase our focus on prayer. We'll expand our prayer wall and encourage everyone to stop by and pray for the names there. We'll also bring prayer and intercession into more and more of the things we do to keep our focus on Jesus and see how he is present and working in everything we face.
- **Training Events** – Finally, we'll host seminars designed to help us grow in our faith in some specific ways throughout the year.

We've already seen God do more than we could have asked or imagined at WCC. In 2026, we expect to see even more of his goodness and power at work as we Grow Together in Christ! So, join us as we follow Jesus and trust Him to work through us to build His church.

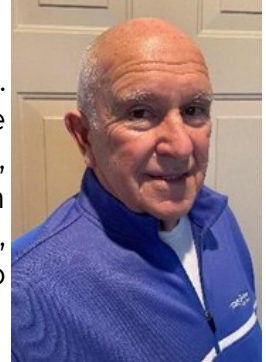

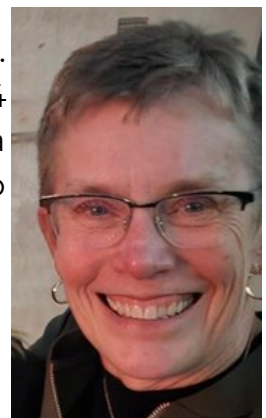
Treasurer (1 year term): Greg Faessler
