Choices

Imagine you are standing in a hallway. This is an infinite hallway with an infinite number of doors. Behind each door is a prize, but the prizes are not evenly distributed. Some doors have very valuable prizes, while others have very worthless prizes. You are allowed to open any number of doors, but you can only choose one prize to keep. Once you open a door, you cannot go back and choose a different prize. The question is: how should you choose a prize?

One strategy is to open the first door you come to and accept the prize behind it. This is a safe strategy, but it is also the least likely to result in a valuable prize. Another strategy is to open as many doors as possible, hoping to find a very valuable prize. This strategy is riskier, but it also has the potential to result in a much greater reward.

This is called the infinite hallway thought experiment and it is designed to illustrate the counterintuitive issues we face in a society of abundance. When you have so many choices, it is hard to imagine being satisfied. We could always do more. Maybe we should leave old habits behind for greater possible future benefits. Maybe true happiness is just a few more posts or videos away on our social media. We live with an abundance of choices and it is somewhat paralyzing. One study showed that grocery stores sell far less jars of jam when they have too many varieties of jam. The stores that have fewer choices actually sell more. That seems counterintuitive, but we are getting exhausted with the choices we are facing each day.

Perhaps this is why Jesus spoke about how blessed the poor were. Perhaps abundance of material and time options is a challenge. The modern disciple of Jesus Christ must decide how to navigate through the crippling abundance of materialism using the empowering abundance of God's grace. We are encouraged to count our blessings. This can often start with possessions and good fortunes. However, let us be attentive to the blessings of faith, love, mercy, and grace from God. God's patience with us is infinite and so we keep searching for prizes in life. Maybe once we find our relationship with God, we should stop there and treasure that prize.

RISE AGAINST HUNGER

A well-known story from the Gospels tells of the time Jesus and His disciples fed more than 5,000 men, women, and children. Jesus is at it again but this time He will be working through His followers at First United Presbyterian Church to feed thousands of people through a program called Rise Against Hunger.

On Wednesday, October 4 starting at 5:45 pm volunteers will gather in the gym to package meals using Rise Against Hunger's time-tested process that delivered 44 million meals to 38 countries, including the United States, in 2022.

Rise Against Hunger meal-packing events provide a fast and fun way to lend meaningful help to people in critical need. The process uses an assembly line to package all meals in about two hours. It is a great way to make a real difference in a very short time.

Since 2005, Rise Against Hunger volunteer groups have packaged nearly 590 million meals, relying on groups of any size in locations across the world to package the meals — this is where FUPC comes into play.

The packaging process is efficient, guick, and anyone of any age can take part. Jesus will be present in the Spirit as FUPC feeds the hungry, but we will need the congregation to come in person to make the event a success. We hope those coming will consider inviting others too. There will be opportunities to ask questions and RSVP between worship services through October 1. Whether you have signed up or not, all are welcome.


On World Communion Sunday, on October 1, we

from Stewardship

"As for me and my family, we will serve the Lord." Joshua 25:14

Stewardship comes in many forms. It represents the dedication of time, treasure, and talents to the furtherance of the glory of God, BUT it is important to remember it is not a one-way street, nor is it one dimensional.

For example, children are gifts from God. Psalm 127:3, to love, to teach, before whom to model faith and works, and demonstrate trust in the Holy Spirt. As parents, we are called to show children the right way (Proverbs 22:6), teach through example integrity, soundness, and trust in our faith (Titus 2:2, 7, 8), demonstrate endurance and encouragement such that we might provide hope and build resilience (Romans 15:4), show the value and benefits of dwelling together in unity, harmony, and fellowship (Psalm 133:1), and to show how to live by faith, not simply by sight (2 Corinthians 5:7).

As our children return to school we do not need to have all the answers. In fact, part of the joy of parenting is slowly removing the scaffolds of protective parenthood and observing our children face and overcome ever increasing challenges. Once we recognize Scripture is useful in teaching (2 Timothy 3:16), we have the opportunity to instill within each child how much God loves them and how unconditional our love is for them, so that we and our children can fully enjoy and unlock all the wonderous blessings of childhood.
