JANUARY - FEBRUARY - MARCH

In Q1, we saw a significant increase in the average number of Boxes of Hope distributed through the Drive Thru, rising from 192 to 250 per week. The Living Free 12-week course launched at the Tabernacle, and through a state opioid grant, we partnered with the Naaman's Center to combat opioid addiction in the community. February featured a Narcan training session for our Living Free counselors, while March highlighted various community outreach efforts, including Easter basket packing events and the successful completion of renovations at the Naaman Center.





JULY - AUGUST - SEPTEMBER

In Q3, we launched our summer outreach program in New Castle County. providing vital resources like Boxes of Hope and Narcan Kits to families in Coachman's Manor and **Spencer Apartments,** supported by dedicated volunteers. Due to funding changes, our drive-thru pantry has shifted to operate only on the last Friday of each month. In August, we distributed a total of 1,150 backpacks, thanks to a generous donation from Cradles to Crayons and assistance from local volunteers. September saw the kickoff of our fundraising efforts with Boscov's coupons and a successful open house at the Naaman Center.









APRIL - MAY - JUNE

In Q2, we celebrated the grand opening of the Naaman Center and concluded the first session of the Living Free program, with a second session set to begin in June. Community engagement efforts included partnerships with Nemours Children's Health to prepare food packs and volunteer support from local students.

We also prepared extensively for this year's Hope Day, confirming Brader Elementary as the event location. We were able to impact over 900 people with free hair cuts, food, and activities for Hope Day!

October

OCTOBER - NOVEMBER - DECEMBER

In Q4, we engaged families through two Super Saturday community fundraisers centered on household, apparel, and electronic gifts. As part of this initiative, we partnered with Boscov's to offer \$5 coupons for 25% off each purchase. We successfully hosted our 5th Annual Turkey Basket Drive-Thru. To conclude the year, we collaborated with Golo to collect warm coats for families in need.
