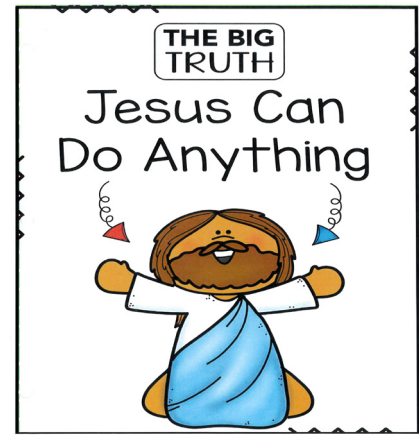

- If you could only pass on one piece of advice to your children, family, or friends, what would it be and why?

Scripture, Discussion and Application

This week, our SGBS leaders have the choice to lead their groups through structured prayer time or this study guide, and we trust their discernment to do what's best for each group. Our study guide this week pulls from a three-part sermon series from Darwin Mason Jr. at the Hillsboro Church of Christ on "Good Grief." There are ways that God does, and the Church and people should, respond to grief that are informed by scripture to help us mourn in holiness. We'll dive into each to be reminded that part of grief is remembering that even when in the darkest of times, God is still good, and He's near.

God and Grief

Read the following scripture:

Psalm 138

Background and context: This is one of David's last psalms, so it was written from a place of maturity and heartache, knowing that David had been through some horrible things – the loss of sons, betrayal by friends and family, adultery, murder, and more. But that means this psalm was also informed by what he's learned through his grief.

Key points: V. 1 - Giving thanks is a whole-hearted effort and shows extreme spiritual maturity when you give thanks through bad circumstances.
V. 2 – God loves us and is faithful because of His name and who He is, not because of who we are.
V. 3 – When we call out to Him, God answers.
V. 8 – God's plan will come to pass.

Discuss: Are there any lessons you've learned in life you only know because of a hard time you went through? If so, what are they?

Exodus 14:10-18

Background and context: The Egyptians are chasing the Israelites and the people are complaining to Moses that they would rather have stayed as slaves, so they cry out to God.

Key points: V. 15 – Like the psalm, the Israelites cried out to the Lord and He answered not by taking away their troubling circumstances but by giving direction and telling them to just keep moving forward.

Discuss: Can you think of a situation where it felt like your only option was to keep moving forward? Did it work?

Isaiah 40:31

Key point: God gives strength to those who wait for Him. The Hebrew word for renew really means to exchange - so God is taking away what was left of you and giving you His own new strength.

Discuss: Has there ever been a time in life when you've felt divine strength help you through a situation?

Mark 4:35-41

Key point: This was a huge storm, and the boat was at risk of going under but that didn't even wake Jesus. When we're dealing with grief, we can feel like we're going under! But the external circumstances aren't what concern God. It's the people and their needs who concern God.

Discuss: Have you ever felt you're in the midst of a significant storm? How did you feel God answered you?

2 Corinthians 12:7-9

- Key point: Sometimes God answers our situation not with removal but with grace, and that's good enough even if the thorn remains.
- Discuss: Are there examples in your life when a bad situation didn't end but God's grace was enough for you?
- To summarize – when you're going through tough things, call on God because He'll answer.

The Church and Grief

Whether we like it or not, we'll be called to help someone with their grief at some point. How we respond in those moments can either complete their healing or make things much worse. We'll recap a few things from Job.

Read Job 2:9-13.

Background and context: Remember Job was righteous but lost all he had in a matter of minutes.

- Key points: V.9 – People grieve in different ways.
It's easy to judge Job's wife but she lost all the same things he did.
V. 11 – These are good friends. They're coming to comfort their friend and in the subsequent verses their actions show their love for Job is genuine even if they fall short in some ways.
- Discuss: Has there been a time in your life when someone's presence while you're grieving has been enough?

In the next several chapters, Job talks with his friends, and it doesn't go well. It is good to remember that grieving is emotional, not logical.

- Key point – When someone's grieving, presence can be more important than anything you might say!
Don't throw Romans 8:28 at people who are hurting.
- Discuss: Do you have any examples in life of when you said something trying to help and it only made a situation worse?

Takeaways:

- Be *patient* when people are grieving – there's no expiration date with grief.
- *Pause* to give time for God to work as only He can.
- *Presence* – be there for the people you love.

People and Grief

Read 2 Samuel 12:15-24.

Background and context: Try not to think of this within the context of whether or not David deserved this but instead through the lens of David's suffering – the loss of his son.

- Key points: Worship allows us to be closer to God and give Him whatever we're dealing with.
Daily and true worship relieves us of our struggles because it reminds us God is still in control.
Grief pulls you inward but worship pulls you upward. The presence of the Lord is within us and it's one of the reasons it's still important for us to get together.
Being together, filled with the Holy Spirit, is where what we can do as individuals ties into what the church can do – we can be there to comfort each other, hold joy for each other, keep faith for each other, praise God together, cry together, and hope together.
And at the end of this section of scripture, realize the terrible thing you're grieving isn't the end. You can keep on going. Read v. 24 again – once we've grieved, we can help others going through it and encourage them!
- Discuss: Do we really understand the power and intimacy of true worship?
What's the most significant or most meaningful thing someone's done for you while you're grieving?

Close in prayer for any specific requests and that in times of grief, we will draw near to God and each other.
