

- Ready or not, Christmas is six weeks away! What is something you like about the holidays? What do you dislike?
- Can you think of the most useful (and appreciated) gift you have ever received? Did you request it? Was it immediately valued or did that come later?

Scripture, Discussion and Application

For the weeks leading up to Christmas, we will be studying five concepts covered in Romans chapter 8. This will include several Sundays with Small Group Bible Studies. Aren't we thankful that the Holy Spirit inspired Paul to write the letter to the Romans and that we have a copy to read and study today? Let's consider these five gifts that we really need listed in this chapter. This opening lesson also serves as an introduction to the series, so let's take a few minutes to understand the context.

Without Jesus, we are guilty.

Romans 6:23 says bluntly, "For the wages of sin is death." This is not a New Testament revelation, as it has been true since the beginning of mankind. We see example after example in the Torah: the flood in Genesis 6, Sodom and Gomorrah in Genesis 19, etc. Again and again, Scripture tells of the people of God making sacrifices - taking the life of an animal to make restitution for their sin. Even the pagan religions held parallel beliefs and practices about sin and sacrifices requiring the death of animals, or even humans.

Read Romans 3:20 and discuss the purpose of the law. Why do we vainly attempt to justify ourselves by our own obedience of the law?

Without Jesus, we are condemned.

Take a moment and consider Paul's blunt explanation about the problem of sin - especially in Romans 7:15-19. How have you experienced this to be true? Meaning, you repeatedly made a pledge to yourself (and perhaps to God) to stop doing something wrong or to begin doing something right, but no matter how hard you tried, you failed to keep your pledge. Discuss.

Without Jesus, we are frustrated.

The opening chapters of Romans explain the universal sin problem of man. We are all sinners, and we all deserve to be punished. And as we discussed from Romans 7, we cannot be good enough to be justified in God's sight. Paul expresses the frustration well in Romans 7:25, "Wretched man that I am! Who will deliver me from this body of death?" Yet, we live in a day when sin is overlooked, downplayed, and even tolerated. In a culture dominated by "I'm okay, you're okay," it is common to balk at the idea of calling out sin for what it is. However, you will not find that view of sin from God or His word. Why is it not only correct but best for us to admit our sin problem?

Now with that very brief overview of the context, read Romans 8:1-8.

In Christ Jesus, we have been freed!

Discuss what it means that there is no condemnation in Christ.

According to verses 2-3, what does Jesus do for us that the law could not do? Discuss what it means to be "in Christ."

Earlier we discussed the need to admit our sin problem and not be dismissive about it. If there is no sin problem to deal with, there is no need for a savior to set us free. (Remember Jesus saying in Luke 7:47 that "He who is forgiven little, loves little.") Discuss why this it true.

The One who set us free said it like this, "So if the Son sets you free, you will be free indeed." Discuss what that means for mankind's sin problem. What does this mean to you?

Close with prayer telling God how much you appreciate the gift of being set free through Jesus.
