

Scripture, Discussion and Application

Leading up to Christmas, we are studying five gifts in Romans chapter 8. We discussed the first gift - FREED - in our previous Small Group Bible Study. The next gift is EMPOWERED and describes the blessing the Holy Spirit is for God's children.

Read Romans 8:9-13. Spend a few minutes discussing the following questions to review this amazing gift.

- Who is the Spirit?
- Why do I need the Spirit?
- Do I have the Spirit living within me?
- How do I live in the Spirit?

Often we read of the disciples being "filled with the Spirit" after they had already received the gift of the Spirit. One commentary explained that phrase to mean under the control or power of the Spirit. It was because of the Spirit's power, the person was able to do, act, or speak. With that understanding, what do you think of the statement below?

"You have as much of the Spirit as you wish to have."

Read Romans 8:14-17 and consider what our adoption tells us about God, what kind of father God is, and what being ADOPTED means for us.
