







In the morning message, we noted three reasons to fight for the true gospel. Read Galatians 1:1-5.

Often Paul couples "grace and peace" in his letters. You will never find peace in your life until you comprehend grace. How have you experienced these two working together?

When someone promotes a false gospel, are you able to defend or explain the true gospel?

Open

- Some people seem to argue about anything and everything. Others will do everything possible to avoid confrontation. Where do you fit between those two extremes?
- What is your spiritual background? Did you grow up in a Christian home and part a local church or did you come to faith later in life?
- How well do you receive new people - at work, in your family, at church? Why is this hard (or easy) for you?

Background

Consider reviewing Acts 12-15 to get an overview of the setting of the letter Paul wrote to the Galatians.

Discuss the implications of the following:

Pagan Gentiles converted to Christianity, abandoning their previous beliefs and practices. Jews did not "convert" to Christianity. They accepted Jesus as the promised Messiah and continued their Jewish practices.

Many of these gentiles had little to no understanding or appreciation for their Jewish heritage. Why would that make it difficult for these believing Jews to accept the gentiles into the church?

Would those without a Jewish background benefit from a better understanding of the Torah? Should they choose to participate in Jewish practices, such as a Passover meal?
