Food Pantry

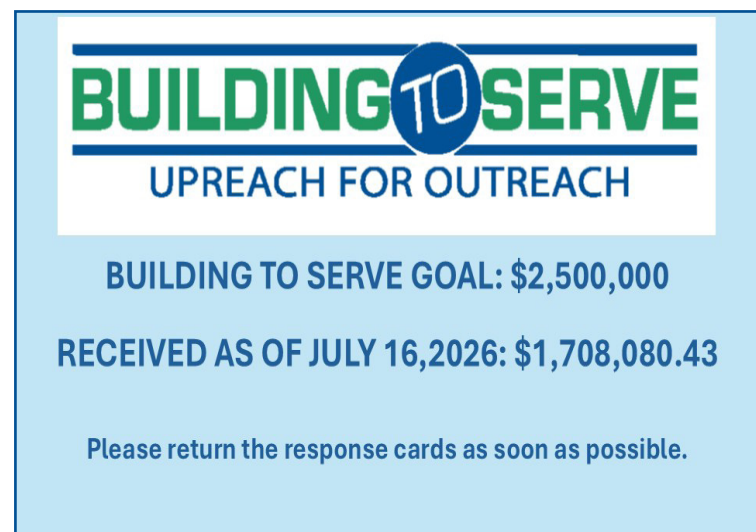
The Food Pantry is in need of canned peaches, small jars of peanut butter (16 oz), canned tuna, and Nutty Buddy Bars.
