

YOU'RE FIRED! (SO BE QUIET)

PRINCIPLE ONE: YOUR ROLE AS THE PARENT MUST CHANGE.

PRINCIPLE TWO:
UNSOLICITED ADVICE IS USUALLY
TAKEN AS CRITICISM.

"And I am certain that God, who began the good work within [your adult child(ren)], will continue his work until it is finally finished on the day when Christ Jesus returns."

- Philippians 1:6 NLT





KEEP LEARNING

PRINCIPLE THREE: YOU CAN'T IGNORE YOUR CHILD'S CULTURE.

"Understand this, my dear brothers and sisters: You must be quick to listen, slow to speak, and slow to get angry." – James 1:19 NLT

Your adult child(ren)'s decisions do not define you.

"Lord, teach me to parent the [adult] children I have, not the [adult children] I thought I would have."





FROM LINGER TO LAUNCH

PRINCIPLE FOUR:

THEY WILL NEVER KNOW HOW FAR THE TOWN IS IF YOU CARRY THEM ON YOUR BACK.

PRINCIPLE FIVE:

MOVE THEM FROM DEPENDENCE TO INDEPENDENCE.

DIFFERING VALUES

PRINCIPLE SIX: YOU CAN'T WANT IT MORE THAN THEY WANT IT.

"Therefore, since we have been justified by faith, we have peace with God ..."


- Romans 5:1 NLT

PRINCIPLE SEVEN:

Financial Independence and Responsibility is **THE GOAL**.

- ◆ **75% OF PARENTS** help their adult children.
- ◆ Develop a clear plan with an **EXIT STRATEGY**.
- Saying I Love You means saying "no".
- ◆ Don't make it **COMPLICATED**.





PRINCIPLE SEVEN: Financial Independence and Responsibility is THE GOAL.

- **♦** Foster **INDEPENDENCE**.
- ◆ Set clear **PARAMETERS**.
- ◆ GIVE according to your needs/ability.
- ◆ Teach healthy STEWARDSHIP.





TEACH HEALTHY STEWARDSHIP

- 1. GOD owns it all.
- 2. There is no such thing as "INDEPENDENT FINANCIAL DECISIONS".
- 3. **DELAYED GRATIFICATION** is the key to financial maturity.
- 4. Spend LESS than you make.
- 5. Debt is **NOT** healthy stewardship.
- 6. A **BUDGET** is a must.
- 7. GIVE 10% and SAVE 10%.

WHAT CAN WE DO TO TRY TO HELP OUR ADULT CHILD(REN) MAKE HEALTHY FINANCIAL CHOICES

- Don't be afraid to talk about money.
- Model healthy financial maturity.
- Offer to help them with a budget.
- Offer to go through a program like Financial Peace University with them.
- Buy them a book like Dave Ramsey's "The Total Money Makeover" as a gift.





One the items from the video was "Setting clear parameters".

 This is something we should all do, creating your own "Personal Parameters", so that no matter who the financial help request comes from we can operate consistently and hopefully avoid being guilted into doing something we shouldn't.

For us, we settled on 4 rules/parameters (from a lot of mis-steps) when it came to people asking for financial help, whether it was our kids or someone else:


- We would never co-sign a loan for anyone.
- 2. If you are asking us for money, you are giving us permission to get all up in your business and ask questions.
- 3. We would never give/loan any amount of money we couldn't afford to NOT get back.
- Depending on the person, we would pay the bill directly, if possible, instead of giving them the money (we all have that family member or friend who isn't good with money).



One of the other items the book talks about is discussing your Estate Plan with your adult child(ren).
