Reader: Our lists are long, even in this strange mess where we live these days. And we want to do it right, we want to be safe, but we also want to be able to enjoy the season. We've got work to do as the time of Christ approaches. We need to put right what has gone wrong, to heal what has been broken, to mend our relationships, and to prepare for the company of God that will come.

The prophet Isaiah reminded us that there is work to be done. "Prepare the way of the Lord, make straight in the desert a highway for our God." When God comes in, then healing is to be found, but we need to make the way; we need to open the door into our lives.

So, we light these candles of HOPE and LOVE as a sign of our faith that the God we worship is not far from us and that we can clear the way for that God to come and dwell with us. We light these candles so that the GIFT of CHRISTmas may point us to His relentless LOVE.
