On Sunday, September 15th, Innisfil Communi-



ty Church was privileged to have Kevin & Julia Garratt as their guests, sharing their incredible story of their prison experience in China. Kevin & Julia were missionaries in China for 30 years, doing great work. After living there without incident, they were

arrested by Chinese security officials in 2014 and accused of spying and stealing military secrets. Interrogation sessions lasted for hours. In February 2015, Julia was released on bail and returned to their apartment. Kevin was charged with espionage and transferred to a prison medical ward, where he spent 19 months. He was released in 2016. The Garratts have documented their "survival story" of their detention in a book, "Two Tears on the Window."


