

## ARE YOU NEW TO COVENANT?

*Thanks for joining us! We pray to be a Christian community that is continually welcoming and encouraging each other to grow spiritually and experience God's grace in our lives while making a concrete difference in the life of our neighborhood here in West Boise for the sake of Jesus Christ.*

**WORSHIP STYLE AT COVENANT:** 8:30 am Worship is simple, with two traditional hymns in a 45 minute service centered on worship and sacrament. 10:30 am worship is a blended style. Music intentionally comes from a variety of genres to remind us of the diversity of our faith, and is an intentional appeal to find unity not in worship style, but unity through a worshipping community in Jesus Christ.

**VISITOR CARDS:** Visitor Cards are found in the pews. Please fill this out and use as your offering during your first visit.

**KIDS AT COVENANT:** Covenant LOVES to have children with us. God put the "wiggles" in children, so don't feel you have to suppress it here. Let kids know that they are at home in this house of worship. Sunday school is offered for children aged 4 through middle school after the Time of Family Engagement at the 10:30 am service. Activity bags and sensory baskets for use during the service are available near the Covenant Kids check-in. Children are also welcome to stay with their family in the sanctuary during worship. The service can also be seen from the foyer, should you need ample space for family needs.

**NURSERY CARE:** If you would like, loving care for infants 6 weeks through age 3 is provided in the Nursery during the 10:30 am service.

**MIDDLE & HIGH SCHOOL:** Research demonstrates that families who worship together are more apt to nurture lifelong discipleship. As such, we encourage families to worship together, and to support developmental teaching, we offer Middle School; Sunday school and a growing, dynamic youth group.

**HEARING ASSISTANCE:** Discrete hearing assistance devices are available at the A/V booth. Large print bulletins are available from the ushers. Sermons are posted on our website (<http://www.cpcboise.org/media/>).
