

Putting Aside and Taking Up

Ash Wednesday is February 14th this year which begins the season of Lent. In its earliest usage, the word Lent meant Spring; although, over time it has come to be synonymous with and used for the forty days, excluding Sundays, preceding Palm Sunday and Holy week. The season is a time of preparation for all believers. It is a time for looking within, fine tuning our focus, seeing what is hidden in the dark recesses of our hearts and minds and for discarding those activities or habits that clutter our minds and hinder us from engaging in that which brings us closer to God. What is Lent?

Lent is a season of forty days, not counting Sundays, which begins on Ash Wednesday and ends on Holy Saturday. The forty days represent the time Jesus spent in the wilderness, enduring the temptation of Satan and preparing to begin his ministry.

Lent is a time of repentance, fasting and preparation for the coming of Easter. It is a time of self-examination and reflection. In the early church, Lent was a time to prepare new converts for baptism. It is an opportunity to reflect on the meaning of discipleship in the light of the events of the life and death of Jesus.

This year, our homilies during Lent will focus on the seven last words of our Savior uttered from the cross. They encapsulate, in terse sayings, the heart of what it meant for him to die for us, and the cost of discipleship for each Christian.

I hope that you will take time during Lent to allow the words of Jesus to impact your life.

The Organ: A General Description

The organ is a wind instrument played from a keyboard, or keyboards. It is a series of pipes placed on a wind chest with valves under the pipes. These valves are opened by the keys using electro-pneumatic action (Southside organ), mechanical action (trackers), or direct electric action.

A constant supply of air at steady pressure is delivered to the wind chest. Today, this is done by an electric blower and a reservoir. The air is blown into the reservoir. The top of the reservoir is weighted to keep the wind at a steady pressure. The air is then delivered from the reservoir to the wind chest through a wind pipe.
