




How do you see through half-truths and self-help trends to access the deep wisdom of God’s Word and the full life found in Him alone? “The Best of Friends” By Phil Knox

From 'Let there be light' to the final 'Amen,' God's big story is about friendship — and friendship changes everything. In this five-part series, Phil Knox explores the power of friendship and the pressures affecting it. Learn how to manage your relational capacity the way Jesus did and how making friends with a diversity of people proclaims the gospel to a lonely, fractured world. Ultimately, discover the truth that the best of friends is Jesus Himself.

The Power of the Resurrection

On the first Sunday of April, we will celebrate the resurrection of the Lord Jesus Christ. Our Savior is alive today and forevermore! We will do this by personalizing Philippians 3:10. It says, "That I may know Him and the power of His resurrection..." Celebrating the resurrection is not merely a historical reflection, but a present tense experience of victory. Let me give you a pathway to experiencing resurrection power in the present tense by connecting Romans 6 to another resurrection in the Bible, the moment Lazarus walked out of the grave.

The main point is for believers to live out the reality that we are dead to sin and alive to God. Jesus raising Lazarus from the dead and calling him out of the tomb (John 11:1-44) is a powerful picture that relates to Romans 6:5-14 in a profound way. My hope is to get us to see this relation clearly.

Notice that the passage we are considering speaks about the power of sin in the past tense. Believers have been set free from the dominion of sin in their lives. **One of the ways Christians can overcome sin is to be reminded how significant a work salvation is.** We were not just good people made better by Jesus, we were dead people made alive.

When we read John 11 we find that Lazarus was dead. It sounds overly simple but there was a belief in ancient Jewish culture that when someone died their spirit would hover over their body for three days hoping to reenter it. While untrue, this is why it is so significant that Lazarus had been dead for *four days* (John 11:17, 39). A teenager today might describe Lazarus as being "like super-dead." In a spiritual sense that was us. A rotting corpse of unrighteousness. **When we are willing to recognize what we were (dead), we will appreciate what we are (alive), and we will celebrate what it took to make that happen (Jesus).**

If it was not for Jesus, Lazarus would have stayed in the tomb, as would we. Romans 6:8-11 tells us that we are united to Christ in His death and resurrection.

In John 11:43, Jesus called Lazarus out of the grave.

Based upon the power of Jesus, Lazarus lived again!

Romans 6:12-14 shows us that based upon our new life we should not allow sin to rule over us. Romans 6:6-7 describes this reality as being freed from the slavery of sin.

In the last verse of the Lazarus narrative, Jesus says something that otherwise might be easy for us to miss. Jesus told the people to help Lazarus, "unbind him and let him go" (John 11:44). Lazarus was wrapped head to toe in grave clothes.

Imagine this newly resurrected man making his way out of the grave still wrapped up in these linen strips. It was probably a rather mummy-ish sight. We should see our sin like the strips of cloth that once bound up a dead body. **We are called, as Lazarus was, to be freed from what once held us in bondage. Grave clothes are for the dead, not the living.**







Why Easter Still Changes Everything

Easter is one of the most joyful celebrations in the Christian faith. Every year we gather to sing, worship, and proclaim the same powerful truth: **Jesus is alive.**

For many students in our youth ministry, Easter can sometimes feel like just another holiday on the calendar—eggs, candy, and a Sunday service that might seem similar to others. But Easter is far more than a tradition. It is the moment that defines our faith and gives us hope that changes our lives today.

The resurrection of Jesus reminds us that the story did not end at the cross. After the pain of Good Friday and the silence of the tomb, God demonstrated His ultimate power and love by raising Jesus from the dead. In that moment, sin was defeated, death was overcome, and a new life became possible for everyone who believes.

For our students, this message is incredibly important. Many young people today face pressure, anxiety, and questions about who they are and what their future holds. Easter reminds them that their identity is not found in popularity, performance, or comparison. Their identity is found in a Savior who knows them, loves them, and conquered the grave for them.

The resurrection also calls us to live differently. Because Jesus is alive, we are invited to live with courage, hope, and purpose. Our faith is not just something we talk about on Sundays—it shapes how we treat others, how we face challenges, and how we love the world around us.

As a youth ministry, our prayer is that students don't just hear the Easter story—they experience its power personally. We want them to know that the same Jesus who walked out of the tomb still transforms hearts today.

This Easter, may we all be reminded that the empty tomb is not just a historical event. It is a promise: **hope is alive, forgiveness is real, and new life is available to all who follow Him.**



