


We LOVE because
HE first LOVED us.

My first newsletter article is a call to passionate prayer. You will realize that I quote Charles Spurgeon, the "prince of preachers," quite often. I believe his perspective on a praying church is helpful here, he says, "If a church is to be what it ought to be for the purposes of God, we must train it in the holy art of prayer." Cinco Baptist Church exists to glorify God by accomplishing His work in the world today. Prayer is an essential aspect of realizing this goal.

It can be easy for our prayer lives to slip into what Jesus calls "vain repetition" (Matt. 6:7). Some days our only communication with God consists of an obligatory bless-the-food petition hurled out into the ether. I want us to pray according to Ephesians 3:20. This text says, "Now to him who is able to do far more abundantly than all that we ask or think, according to the power at work within us." I don't know about you, but I can think of some pretty big things to ask God to do in and through Cinco Baptist Church. Ephesians 3:20 tells us that God can do bigger things than even the biggest thing we can ask Him to do in our church.

This is the kind of prayer I'm calling us to...a passionate, personal pursuit of the glory of God in and through Cinco Baptist Church. Whatever part of the ministry God has put on your heart to specifically pray for, know that God is able to work "far more abundantly" than even the most audacious request you can bring before the throne of grace (Heb. 4:16).

As Paul wrote this part of the letter to the church at Ephesus, perhaps a smidge of doubt lingered in the minds of believers as He described the power of God. So, the Holy Spirit inspired Paul to provide an example of the power of God. Did you notice what Paul used to justify his description of the incomprehensible work of God? If the Ephesian believers doubted God's power to do great things, Paul encouraged them to look to "the power at work within us." We can see the power of God in the created order all around us. But the most profound and powerful work of God is a sinner saved by grace. Think about it, for all things to instantaneously exist, God simply had to speak. For sinful rebels to be forgiven, God had to die. If you ever doubt that God can and will do incredible things, remember and be encouraged by your own salvation.



**John 13:14–15** "Now that I, your Lord, and Teacher, have washed your feet, you also should wash one another's feet. I have set you an example that you should do as I have done for you."

Dear Church and School Families,

As I've been praying and reflecting on the state of our hearts, our church, our school, and our community... one image continues to stir my heart: the moment Jesus knelt to wash the feet of His disciples. It was an act of humility, love, and radical peace. In a world that often encourages us to judge, divide, and gossip, Jesus invites us to kneel. It's simple yet deeply convicting. It reminds me the posture Jesus took...not just physically, but spiritually. Washing the disciples' feet wasn't about cleanliness; it was about surrender, humility, and love.

Recently, I heard a phrase that's been resonating in my spirit: "It's hard to throw stones when you are washing someone's feet." What a profound truth. When we choose to serve, we disarm ourselves. When we choose compassion over condemnation, we become agents of peace. The posture of a servant leaves no room for superiority or hostility...it opens the door to grace.

In today's world, it's easy to pick up stones. Stones of judgment, criticism, resentment, and pride. We see someone stumble, and we're tempted to point. We hear a differing opinion, and we're quick to argue. We feel hurt, and we want to retaliate. But Jesus shows us another way.

We are called to be peacemakers...not peacekeepers who avoid conflict, but peacemakers who enter the mess with <u>humility and hope</u>. That means choosing compassion over condemnation. It means seeing the image of God in every person, even when it's hard. It means remembering that we are all sinners saved by grace, and that grace is meant to be shared.

In our church, our school, our homes, and in our community, we are called to be feet-washers...not in ritual, but in spirit. We must listen before we speak. We must forgive before we accuse. We must love before we judge.

Peace is not passive...it is active, intentional, and often uncomfortable. But it is always holy.

Be assured we are all in need of grace. And it makes it nearly impossible to throw stones...because our hands are already full of love.


I pray we are a church and school that kneels...together...in service, in forgiveness, and in love. Because when we do, we reflect the heart of Christ...and in that reflection, peace becomes not just a possibility, but a reality.

I pray we personify the peace of Jesus in every interaction, every disagreement, and every moment of tension. Because when we kneel in love, we rise in unity.

Let us be known not for the stones we throw, but for the feet we wash.
