6- **Christmas Eve** was a stunner for how well folks from the community and from our church came out. **144**! We haven't had that many in attendance for any event since we came 5 years ago. We're trying to follow them up. That's one of the nice things about COVID-19 - we can ask for contact info for contact tracing purposes.

7- We finally have children! I mean at the church! Yes, a group of about 10 kids did a little 12-minute

Christmas presentation that was cute as all git out! 15 months ago we only had 2 families with kids...



8- Sadly, **my father passed into eternity** in early December. It was a time of mixed emotions as Dad had

suffered from dementia and had not recognized who I was for well over a year. He contracted COVID-19 about a week before and although he did not have significant symptoms, it evidently took its toll. April and I drove back to be in the service and to meet with family. Darlene was not able to go. Sadly, as well-known and respected as Dad was, the decision was made to only allow family to attend the service. The Gospel was able to be shared, but with a much smaller crowd than would have been present absent COVID-19.
